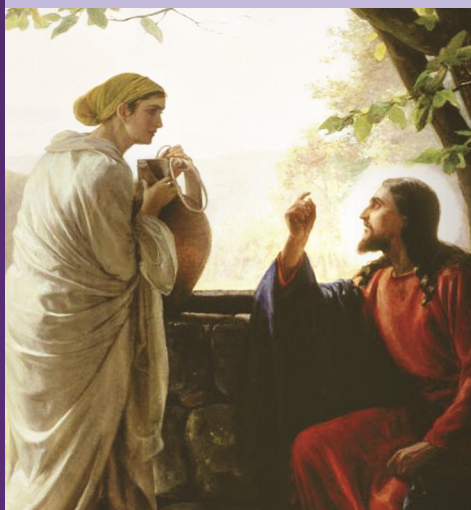

Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels Parish,

As we wade midway into the holy penitential season, it is good to take stock of where we are in our Lenten life of prayer, penitential sacrifice, and almsgiving. Have we activated a course in our life that releases us from servile bondage to often unnecessary time-wasting habits so that we are unfettered to pray more? And have we taken that Scriptural advice to “Listen to Him” or are we “doubling down” in what we may sometimes consider our own sometimes uninspired pattern of prayer that, while being beautiful prayers we say, needing greater inspiration in doing them? Are we truly giving ourselves over to good, silent prayer time? We have a chance to immerse ourselves in greater Eucharistic prayer with the Masses of the forthcoming week, Monday through Thursday, March 20 - 23, being in the evening. Take the time NOW to set next week aside for our Parish Lenten Retreat Masses and presentations outlined in the inserted bulletin flier! Our minds will be lifted immediately after the evening Masses in inspiration for four evenings of presentation of a canon of Klosterneuburg, a good and holy priest, connecting us to the Passion of Christ in a revelatory manner. By joining in this our Parish Lenten Retreat, one’s prayer life may receive a kick-start or a fine-tuning in being able to focus on prayer throughout the rest of Lent and Holy Week in regard to the “Instruments of Christ’s Passion”.

While retreat Masses are at 6:30 p.m., from Mar. 21, Tuesday, through Mar. 23, Thursday, however, at the start of the retreat, a week from this Monday, March 20, Mass that first evening is appropriately led with our adult choir leading us in musical praise in celebration of the great Solemnity of St. Joseph so that we begin instead at 6 pm, as we have pretty much the same elements of a Sunday Mass.

Our parish observance of St. Joseph, however, kicks off on what is normally the traditional “vigil” of St. Joseph, the evening before the traditional March 19 date of his solemnity. Immediately after our 4:30 p.m. vigil Mass March 18, people are invited to our parish hall for a great celebration. Maybe we have been negligent in seeing to almsgiving this Lent. Our celebration including the free-will offering of the traditional Italian pasta St. Joseph’s Dinner along with the St. Joseph Table honoring him that will be loaded with baskets of goods offered as silent auction items can help remedy that shortcoming in our Lenten practices. All of the St. Joseph Dinner and Table auction offerings we make benefit the good Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George whom we honor and help as our Lenten parish charity. PLEASE be generous in giving to this worthy charity!

Finally, our penitential sacrifices go on: in different methods of fasting and abstaining – not just from drink and foods – but from whatever that keeps us from having a much closer relationship to Our Lord Jesus Christ – whether different forms of technology, of television, or internet, or an obsession with being up to date with “the news” or social media. However, this coming Friday, March 17, known traditionally as St. Patrick’s Day, is unique in being able to eat corned beef.

SPECIAL DISPENSATION from abstaining from meat
MARCH 17: Archbishop Naumann formally declared, “I hereby dispense from the obligation to abstain from meat on Friday, March 17, 2023, all the faithful of the archdiocese as well as all those who may be visiting or traveling through the archdiocese on that day. While no one is obliged to use this dispensation, anyone who does choose to use the dispensation and eat meat on that Friday, I exhort them to choose another day that week in which they may perform an act of penance (abstain from meat, do an act of charity, an exercise of piety or some other penance).”

May you celebrate both St. Patrick’s Day and St. Joseph’s Day in the most fitting and Catholic of manners!

Catholics - Did You Know?

The Catholic Church is celebrating St. Joseph’s Solemnity on March 20. It is transferred to Monday, as the usual day of the Solemnity, March 19, this year falls on the important Laetare Sunday of Lent.

You will often see St. Joseph depicted as an old man in artwork and statues. However, many saints and theologians believe St. Joseph was a young man. If you were God, what type of man would you choose to be the foster father of Jesus, who was going to redeem mankind? What type of man would you want to be the spouse and guardian of the most perfect human being, our Blessed Mother? Here are three good explanations, taken from the book “Consecration to St. Joseph” by Fr. Donald Calloway.

- Remember, people had to walk everywhere. The trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem (with a very pregnant Mary) was 80 miles over rough, hilly trails. Then, after Jesus’ birth, an angel instructed Joseph to take the Holy Family away from Herod’s slaughter to safety in Egypt, over 40 miles away. Several years later, the angel told St. Joseph to take the Holy Family back to Nazareth, a trip of at least 120 miles. An old man would not have the stamina to do all that walking while carrying their possessions.
- St. Joseph knew it was vital to protect our Immaculate Mother and the Child Jesus from hazards like wild animals, the Romans, and thieves. Would God choose an old man - or someone young, strong, alert, and able to fight to defend the Holy Family?
- St. Joseph needed to be a model father for Jesus, which includes being a hard worker. As a woodworker, Joseph had to be physically strong to move heavy wood and chop and carve it into finished products. This is no job for an older man who is weaker, tires easily, and may be arthritic!

All evidence points to God willing the Foster Father of Jesus to be in the prime of his life. Next week will explain why artists have depicted St. Joseph as an old man.
