

Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels Parish,

I wish especially to thank some very important persons: Cathy Kern, Karen Gaffney, Paul Rittof, Rodney Ashley & the Knights of Columbus, for magnificently pulling off, once again, the St. Joseph's Day Dinner Table. They did a most marvelous job raising awareness, preparing and executing the dinner and silent auction of 22 gift baskets. We will not be able to do this next year unless new persons step up to the plate willing to take over from Cathy and Karen organizing and setting up the dinner, tables and auction. While it is an exhilarating and wonderful event, new blood must step up by this autumn to bring the festive celebration to fruition next March or it will cease to exist here at HAB. If you are interested in taking the lead on this, please contact the office.

We have multiple priests – at least five – shriving sins at 1 pm, PALM SUNDAY, April 2, in our parish hall. They will hear confessions in separate classrooms and offices. It has gone very smoothly in the past. Penitents have the opportunity for face-to-face or anonymous confessions with the peace of privacy and no chance of being overheard by others. Go to confession! One time remains for confessions besides Palm Sunday this week: on Spy Wednesday, April 5, from 6 pm to 7 pm in the main church confessional. This is the last opportunity for scheduled confessions before Easter. There are none heard here during the Sacred Paschal Triduum.

Finally, I would like to extend a most important invitation to journey to Easter in the most spiritual and uplifting religious way possible by participating in the Sacred Mysteries of the Most Hallowed Paschal Triduum from Holy Thursday through to the Easter Vigil Mass ceremonies. For those thinking that because of their family situation or ages of family members that they cannot witness to the entirety of the Easter Vigil Mass, we have two beautiful Easter Sunday Masses. For some persons - and I hope for the one reading this letter undergoing the entirety of these Sacred Mysteries of the last days of Our Lord Jesus' life on this earth can awaken a profound lie-changing spirituality! It may bring it to life, as never before, or reignite your deeply formed faith that has lain dormant. It can transport you to a greater prayer life or bring about a realization to become more formed in the Catholic Faith of our forbearers.

These days, from Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday, are the most important and pivotal in the entire Church calendar - and in history - because on it devolves the salvation of mankind. By entering into the mysteries of the last half of Holy Week, we celebrate the most wondrous love ever known on earth: Our Lord Jesus Christ's saving love that prompted Him to fully follow God the Father's Will to suffer and die to save our souls. Jesus instituted both the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist and the Sacrament of the Holy Priesthood at the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper we celebrate Holy Thursday at 7 pm, April 6.

While He suffered His Agony in the Garden, we commemorate it by adoration in the little church at the Altar of Repose after Holy Thursday Mass until just before we celebrate the Liturgy of the Passion and Death of Our Savior at the hour He died at 3 pm on Good Friday.

Good Friday is when we begin our own Novena of Divine Mercy, praying the Divine Mercy chaplets through to Easter Octave Sunday with our parish Divine Mercy Holy Hour at noon, April 16. But first, we walk with Christ His Via Crucis, or Way of the Cross, in the Fourteen Stations of the Via Dolorosa, recalling the meandering street in Jerusalem of the Way of Christ's Sorrows, carrying His Cross on the road to His Death, beginning at the hour His Passion began on the Cross at noon, Good Friday, April 7.

This truly ONE LITURGY that began with the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper on Holy Thursday, ends with the triumph of Christ at the 8 pm Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday, April 8, coming anew into His church of Holy Angels. He is symbolized by the fresh Paschal Candle that enlightens our lives anew on entering the darkness of the church at the start of the end of the three-day liturgy.

After the resplendent Vigil Mass with the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion for those youth and adults entering into or being fully initiated into the Roman Catholic Church, we appropriately continue the celebration at the parish hall with a full-on festive, late-night dinner with great merriment and joy. Please join us! And if some of our liturgical schedule does not accord with your work schedule, please seek out those liturgies elsewhere.




Contemporary Choir sings at the 4:30 Mass on one Saturday of each month. Rehearsal will be on the day of at 3:30pm.
