

Pope Francis makes urgent call to recover Eucharistic Adoration in the Church

Memorial of St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin and Martyr 9 August 2023

Dear Parish Family and Friends of the Parish,

On the Feast of Our Lady, Queen of the Holy Angels, of the Portiuncola, after which our adoration chapel is named, Pope Francis gave a homily at World Youth Day celebrations. After noting that "to trust every day in the Lord and in his word, words are not enough" but rather "a lot of prayer is needed," he pointed out to the approximately 1,100 attendees that the Church has abandoned prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The following below lines were included in the pope's presentation and the above headline appeared in reporting this homily:

"Here I would like to ask a question, which everyone can respond in his or her heart: How do I pray? As "blah, blah, blah", half asleep before the tabernacle because I don't know how to talk to the Lord? Do I pray? How do I pray? Only in adoration, only in the presence of the Lord, do we truly rediscover our taste and passion for evangelization. Oddly enough, we have lost the prayer of adoration; and everyone, priests, bis-hops consecrated men and women, need to recover it, this ability to be quiet in the Lord's presence. Mother Teresa [of Calcutta], busy about so many things in life, never neglected adoration, even at times when her faith was shaken and she wondered if it was all true or not. A similar moment of darkness was also experienced by Therese of the Child Jesus."

"In prayer, we overcome the temptation to carry out a 'ministry of nostalgia and regrets'. Once, in a convent, there was a nun - this really happened - who complained about everything. I forget her name, but the other nuns called her 'Sister Lamentation'. How many times do we turn our frustrations and disappointments into complaints! Once we abandon those complaints, we find the strength to put out once more into the deep, without ideologies, without worldliness: the spiritual worldliness that overtakes us and gives rise to clericalism. A clericalism not only of clerics, for clericalized lay persons are worse than clerics. That clericalism is our ruin. As a great spiritual master once said, spiritual worldliness - which provokes clericalism - is one of the worst evils that can come about in the Church. We need to surmount our difficulties without ideologies, without worldliness, impelled by a sole desire: that the Gospel be preached to all people." These are the most powerful words compelling us to pray on a weekly basis, yes, taking on regular hours, in Our Lady Queen of the Holy Angels Adoration Chapel.

After a search among multiple persons – to whom all I am thankful applied – to take on the role of Director of Religious Education for Children, we have a new D.R.E. We went through submitted cover letters and resumes and conducted interviews. I am happy to announce that among a strong field of candidates, we have as our new D.R.E., Christina "Tina" Dotson. She has a proven track record of experience in previously successfully being D.R.E. at another Catholic parish, has taught in the classrooms of all grades, has provided faith formation for the Sacraments for children and adults, has led and facilitated parent meetings, domestic church activities, and student retreats as well as coordinated Totus Tuus at a parish. She also is the founder and coordinator of "Family Vocation Day" and has received the 2022 Bishops Recognition Award. For those of you unfamiliar with Tina, you might even run into her at one of our daily Masses she sometimes frequents. The staff and parish of Holy Angels, as well as I, the pastor, are most happy to WELCOME
