

Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels,

Tomorrow, Monday, August 28, is the great feast of the son of St. Monica: St. Augustine, a Father of the Church and the "Doctor of Grace." He is known as the most famous convert after Saul of Tarsus became St. Paul, Apostle to the Gentiles. Besides having written the most famous autobiography of Christian conversion, The Confessions of St. Augustine, which every Christian should read, he has many famous lines, but the most renowned being, "Our hearts are restless, [Lord God,] until they rest in you!" Here is it in context to the writing around it:

Great are You, O Lord, and greatly to be praised; great is Your power, and of Your wisdom there is no end. And man, being a part of Your creation, desires to praise You — man, who bears about with him his mortality, the witness of his sin, even the witness that You resist the proud, — yet man, this part of Your creation, desires to praise You. You move us to delight in praising You; for You have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You. Lord, teach me to know and understand which of these should be first: to call on You, or to praise You; and likewise to know You, or to call on You. But who calls upon You without knowing You? For he that knows You not may call upon You as other than You are. Or perhaps we call on You that we may know You. But how shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? Or how shall they believe without a preacher? Romans 10: 14 And those who seek the Lord shall praise Him. For those who seek shall find Him, Matthew 7:7 and those who find Him shall praise Him. Let me seek You, Lord, in calling on You, and call on You in believing in You; for You have been preached unto us. O Lord, my faith calls on You that faith which You have imparted to me, which You have breathed into me through the incarnation of Your Son, through the ministry of Your preacher.

He wrote and offered the most eloquent and articulate epistles, meditations, reflections and some of the most superb sermons and homilies of all time.

Some of the best lines in our recently concluded book study of Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist came from St.

Augustine. In his homilies on the Gospel of St. John:

The manna also came down from heaven; but the manna was a shadow, **this** [the Bread of Life that is the Holy Eucharist is the truth. 'If anyone shall have eaten of this Bread, he will live forever; and the Bread which I shall give, is my Flesh for the life of the

(Tractate on St. John, 26:13)

For Augustine, the Eucharistic mystery was so real that he even called Christians to give to it the adoration due to God alone: 'No one eats that Flesh unless he has first adored it . . . and we sin by not adoring'

(On the Psalms 98:9).

St. Augustine, pray for us to be great believers and charitable Catholics!
