Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels,

As we prepare for the "End of the Year" holidays, starting with Thanksgiving weekend this coming week, so many things crowd together to battle for our attention. In focusing on the essentials, the true essentials, we are sure to be more grounded in celebrating the festivities of each holiday all the richer.

What can be better than coming to the most perfect celebration for Thanksgiving, which is that of the Holy Eucharist – with the very word "Eucharist" meaning "Thanksgiving" – within the celebration of our 9 am Holy Sacrifice of the Mass Thanksgiving morning, and having wine and good food specially blessed?

Sometimes it takes others to help us appreciate all we have in the order of grace. This autumn, I received a lovely note from a former parishioner *in her twenties* who wrote:

As I was unpacking in New York, I found my adoration chapel card for Holy Angels and I wanted to get it back to the church. Thank you for making adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist available there 24/7 – it is the dearest gift! And I am realizing it more now as we only have one church in all of Manhattan for 24/7 adoration and even here it has not yet begun because we don't have all the adoration hours filled. Someday soon, I hope!

I was blown away that in all of Manhattan there is not one 24/7 adoration chapel! We are so very fortunate to have ours! I pray more and more people will come to it on a regular basis and sign on for an hour a week to adore, give glory, praise and thanks to God, and to better their relationship with Our Eucharistic Lord and, thus, enhance their spiritual lives.

With thoughts of turkey, dressing and stuffing, mountains of mashed potatoes and gravy, cranberries, pumpkin, and pecan pies dancing through our heads in anticipation of this week's great holiday, we naturally turn to helping others so they can better enjoy the holy days and holidays. Our Angel Tree gifts and Operation St. Nicholas are just a couple of ways to do that! Here are excerpts from a "thank-you letter" we received in the recent past from a chaplain from our Archdiocese on his reception of the care package posted him in another continent:

Dear Father Mc Donald, Honorable Knights, and Holy Angels Parishioners.

Thank you for your care package to me. It is always amazing how supportive folks back home can be to our troops that are deployed. I enjoyed your package of goodies, some I shared with other soldiers, some I was able to share with a few of the local nationals who don't have much money and they are often the backbone to keeping up the camp by cleaning the facilities. We are all grateful to you.

I m doing well, my schedule is full, and it definitely has been a great learning experience. My ministry is diversified. Similar to my priestly duties as a pastor who is in charge of a parish, I am the Task Force Brigade Chaplain in a multinational force environment with NATO so I am the lead chaplain for the Brigade Command Many times, in order to transport our Unity Ministry Team to get to where we need to be, we will fly on a Black Hawk helicopter, which is pretty cool! I am involved with a number of counseling sessions with the troops especially during the holiday times, or in times of crisis, which can come at any time or moment of the day.

I enjoy my ministry, and I know the good Lord has me here for his purposes. May God reward you for your kindness! Let us remember with our prayers and our charity those such as our troops, emigrants, immigrants and those with less monetary means, as well as those in crisis at the holidays as we celebrate the great festivities of November and December.
