

Lenten Ember Wednesday, 2024

Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels Parish,

It is so very hard to process the insanity, viciousness, and sheer **EVIL** of the random shooting near Union Station Ash Wednesday that devastated our metropolitan community by the number of innocent victims and the death of the Catholic lady laid to rest in a Mass of Christian Burial this Saturday, Feb. 24. That the young men who were adults involved in the shooting death, and others with them, came with guns intent, it proved, on using them, were so easily aroused and totally provoked by another simple looking at them, to start to fire just for that, a mere look! - and in the midst of countless other children and people, with the shooters oblivious to all around them, and for a shooter to admit to the police the lamest excuse imaginable of firing - that of "just being stupid" reveals the depths of one's inhumanity to other fellow human beings, and speaks profoundly to the loss of our Judeo-Christian culture, the lack of civility, and the depravity of our society. For the adult shooters and the juveniles retained, we need to pray for their souls and their conversions as we certainly pray for the victims and their families.

In the midst of processing all of that, it is uplifting to read: "On the family's request, Harrison Butker, a devout Catholic player for the Kansas City Chiefs, has provided a jersey to the family of the shooting victim, Lisa Lopez-Galvan, at the Chiefs' Super Bowl Championship Rally for her corpse to wear as she is laid to rest. Lisa, a Catholic mother of two, was at the rally wearing a Butker jersey. Harrison Butker's statement reads, 'Murder is a sin that cries out to God for vengeance and I pray the men involved in this tragedy will be brought to justice. Hearing that she was a fan of my outspokenness for our shared Catholic Faith makes this even more personal.... While the family is mourning their loss and grappling with their numerous injuries, I will continue to pray for their healing and the repose of Lisa's soul."

Another uplifting thing to share: We are grateful for the generosity and care of persons that gave at our Jim Caviezel talk December 2 free-will offerings that totaled \$2,040.00 to **ReHope** that provides housing, treatment, and lifelong sustainment services for women and children victims of human trafficking.

I am very excited about our upcoming Holy Week Parish Mission Retreat. I hope that all of you have marked your calendars for it, Mon, Mar 25 thru Wed Mar 27 in preparation for the Most Sacred Paschal Triduum.

Are you called to spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament?

The short answer is, of course, you are! At the Sacrament of Baptism, we all received a vocational call to holiness. So, what does that mean?

It means that, in baptism, we are all called to be children of God. We cannot be His children without knowing Him. Holiness can be described as knowing God. How do we most effectively get to know Him? By spending time with Him!

The call to be holy is rooted in Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount. He has just introduced the Beatitudes and has laid out a radically new approach to living life, explaining to the crowds that they must love their neighbor as themselves, avoid retaliation, and love their enemies. He concludes this portion of His discourse with the words, "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48).

"Perfect" here can be understood as "merciful." Or holy. This is the call to holiness: to be merciful, just as our heavenly Father is merciful to us. We cannot become what we have not taken time to know.

To be merciful is understood only in knowing Jesus. He is the author of mercy. In the noise of today's world, make time – take time – to know Him.

During these Lenten days, consider your response to your baptismal call to holiness. How might you get to know Jesus better? Time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament might be a great answer to that question!
