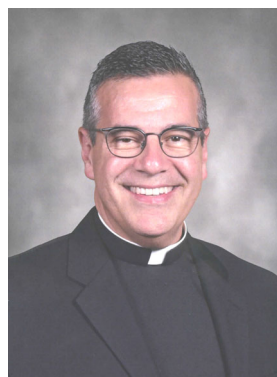

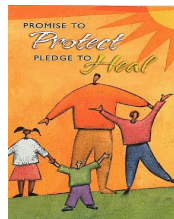

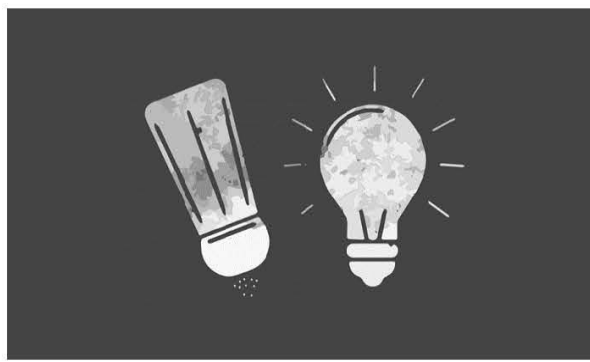
Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

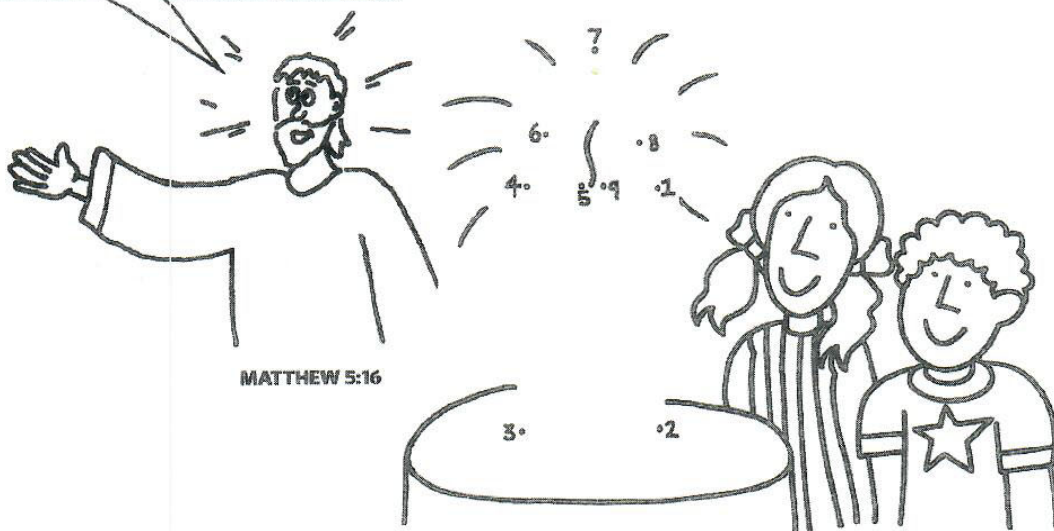

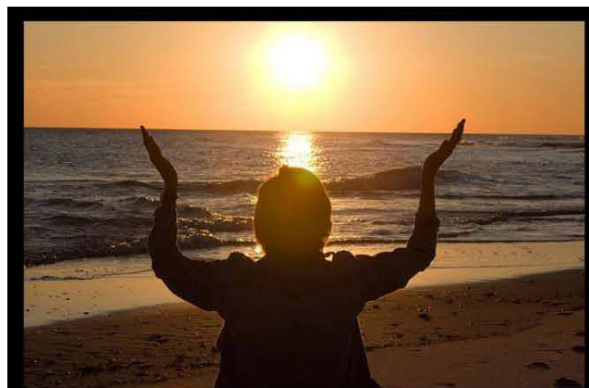

We Welcome New and Returning Volunteers

We begin each shift at the ministry with a prayer. We are open in the mornings only, so a volunteer shift will typically be 3 hours long plus the time it takes to commute. We ask that volunteers commit to one shift per week. No special skills are required, but the virtues of patience, kindness, flexibility, and a desire to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ are what makes our ministry shine. We check people in at the desk, assist them in finding clothing, fill grocery bags, lift and carry bags and boxes, unpack, sort, fold and hang donated items, and we have fun working together.

We Especially Request Donations of the Following:

Clothing and weather protection-

- Jackets & warm clothes, hats, gloves, rain gear
- Warm blankets
- **Men's jeans and work pants, sizes 32-44**

Groceries-

- Canned meat such as tuna, chicken, or sausage & peanut butter
- Tab top cans of food that can be meals (hearty soup, chili, spaghetti)
- Individually wrapped portions of healthy items such as nuts or protein bars

We Gladly Accept and Distribute the Following:

- Clean, gently used or new basic clothing for all ages including infants. This includes shoes, hats, gloves, nightwear, and accessories such as belts and handbags. Clothing should be modest and free of negative slogans and sexual innuendo.

- **Groceries, unopened, and well within expiration dates.**
- **Basic toiletries and personal items including diapers, moist wipes, and hygiene products.**
