From the desk of Father José,

The Lord is my Shepherd, there is nothing I shall want!

This weekend in our Church we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. It happens to be one of my favorite images of Jesus. He simply knows how to call His sheep to follow Him. He also knows how to guide them in the midst of it all. As the Shepherd calls, discernment of His voice must be done by those following Him — Daily. In the midst of so much noise, movement, darkness, and for sure danger — the Shepherd knows how to call each one of us.

As I pray with this Gospel, I invite us to take time to discern the Lord's voice. This past Sunday, Pope Francis invited us to practice our daily examination of conscience. Here are some questions we can use daily, in our nightly Jesuit examination of Conscience.

THANKSGIVING

Lord, I realize that all, even myself, is a gift from you. Today, for what things am I most grateful?

INTENTION

Lord, open my eyes and ears to be more honest with myself. Today, what do I really want for myself?

EXAMINATION

Lord, show me what has been happening to me and in me this day.

Today, in what ways have I experienced your love?

CONTRITION

Lord, I am still learning to grow in your love. Today, what choices have been inadequate responses to your love?

HOPE

Lord, let me look with longing towards the future.

Today, how will I let you lead me to a brighter tomorrow?

ESPERANZA


Señor, déjame mirar con anhelo hacia el futuro.

Adult Confirmation at St. Charles Borromeo – Sessions begin May 2

"The effect of the Sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit, as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost"

Many Catholic adults have been baptized and received the Sacrament of First Communion but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation. The Adult Confirmation program at St. Charles Borromeo is for Catholic adults, ages 18 and above, who have been baptized, participate in the Eucharist, and desire the Sacrament of Confirmation. This is a condensed program consisting of online sessions on Tuesday evenings and in-person sessions on Sunday afternoons. The sessions begin the first week of May, and the Confirmation Mass will be on Friday, June 16.

Registration for Adult Confirmation is available now. This can be done either online or in-person on Sunday, April 23 or Sunday, April 30 at 12:00 pm (after 11:00 am mass). Sessions will be in English. 2. PRAY

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that the Good Shepherd calls his own sheep and leads them out of the flock, and they recognize his voice. How many times have you been attentive to God's voice in your life?



Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

As a family or individually, take a moment to listen and reflect with this song [HERE](#) (YouTube - Vineyard Worship UK & Ireland) When finished, invite your family to pray together:

Lord Jesus, you who know me and love me so much, teach me to recognize myself as a sheep of Your flock. Show me the way to fulfill Your Will. May You always be my shepherd, my guide, my Lord. May your mother always protect me. Don't turn away from me, Lord, forgive my mistakes and sins, and my lack of faith. Amen.

3. TALK

Jesus tells us: "I came so that you might have abundant life. Pick one of the following activities to do with your family. Each family may choose what they would like to do, or do both.

For adults: imagine one concrete way you can follow the voice of Jesus to lead a good and happy life. Please reflect on the questions below, and if desired, journal your answers and share with the rest of the family your thoughts.

- What does it mean to me when I hear that Jesus gives me life in abundance?
- What does it mean that "Jesus calls me by my name"? When do you hear Jesus pronounce your name?
- What does Jesus mean when he says "I am the Door"?

(Parents: it would be wonderful if your children hear you tell them how you follow the voice of Jesus in your life. You can help facilitate the conversation with the children during this moment. Appropriate answers would include experiences around reading the Bible, or listening to the Scriptures during mass, etc. Allow for anyone who wants to share to do so.)

For children: have them make one of the crafts offered in the handout that can be found [HERE](#). As they work on their craft, ask questions such as:

- Where can you hear the voice of Jesus?
- What is Jesus saying to you?
- Does Jesus know your name?
- What can you do to follow Jesus?

Family challenge: considering today's Gospel, this week I will be attentive to all the different voices that I hear and call me. I will be attentive to the different ways that Jesus calls me by name. I will give myself some time to talk with him and tell him "Thank you, Jesus."

4th Sunday of Easter: Lectionary 49

Glory to God

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Reading 1 Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do, my brothers?" Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call." He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

Reading 2 1 Pt 2:20b-25

Beloved: If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps. *He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.* When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly.

He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel Jn 10:1-10

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."
