

From the desk of Father José,

Today in our liturgical year marks the end of our Easter Season after our last Mass. There is a very practical thing that happens in our sanctuary at the end of our Sunday Eucharistic celebrations: the Easter Candle is placed by the Baptismal Font, reminding us that through Baptism we are destined for the resurrection in the peace of God. And now, we continue our daily journey in the life of the Church with the season of Ordinary Time.

In countless ways I have experienced the divine story of hope and peace in ordinary ways with our extraordinary people of God. I take this moment to *thank you* and the many who have shared your journey and story with me. This May 30th I will celebrate my Silver Jubilee as a priest of Jesus Christ. Please know that the inner peace and trust you have shared in your witness to the Faith has molded me in so many extraordinary ways. I would like to share with you some of the formative years of my priesthood.

1998-2002 was a time of laying foundations as a newly ordained priest at our Lady of Peace, North Hills. I had the chance to simply try new things and be open to new beginnings. These years were free of administration and filled with new experiences. So many offered words of encouragement: *take your time! You are still growing, and before you know it, you will be better at this or that.* This reassurance carried me along and allowed me to be free.

2002-2018 was a time of so many new discoveries. I arrived at St. Anthony's, Long Beach as an Associate and before I knew it, I was involved with administration. There were so many moments of questioning: *what if? Maybe I should take a step back? How can I lead? I am too young!* Well, Lord, here I am. I come to do your will. These remarkable years were also times of many personal losses: my father, mother, and nephew. These losses molded me to know and to appreciate life in a different way. I learned to speak less at funerals and witness more in silence. Amid challenging times in ministry and administration, the experience of God's grace and many faith-filled moments gave me the strength for the mission.

2018-Present has been a time of seeking: *Lord, what is your mission for me at St. Charles?* I have asked this plenty of times! And as the Gospel today reminds us, I kept hearing the words: *"Be at peace, God will provide."* This has been my new mantra and motto. Little did I know, Covid would also bring significant struggles and sorrows along the journey. Through it all, peace has reinforced me along my path here at St. Charles. Losing my brother and my brother-in-law along with so many who died during the pandemic marked my soul. The more I wrestle with so many ideas and new ways of ministry, entering another chapter in my life, the more I hear the words of Jesus: *Peace be with YOU.*


Reflecting on this peace, I know where it comes from. I know how to go to it, in vulnerability and openness. It is in the Eucharist. It is with the people of God. It is with my family who love me and support me. It is with my extended fraternity of priests. It is found among the dedicated and holy religious women, deacons, and with the people of God. Even when we speak different languages, like the book of Acts reminds us today, we are able to communicate in the language of love through the Eucharist. The presence of God in the present moment and in the Eucharist grants me the grace to simply be at peace knowing for sure that God will provide.

Let us continue praying and being there for each other in the Eucharist. For without the Lord, we go hungry and thirsty. He is our nourishment and our guide. With the Lord we can *go out and not be afraid.* In this confidence and peace, I look forward greatly to the next 25 years of ministerial priesthood in Jesus Christ. Be assured of my love and prayers for all of you as I remain your brother, uncle, friend, pastor, priest, and, above all, companion on the journey.

Hoy en nuestro año litúrgico marca el final de nuestro Tiempo Pascual después de nuestra última Misa. Hay una cosa muy práctica que sucede en nuestro santuario al final de nuestras celebraciones eucarísticas dominicales: el Cirio Pascual se coloca junto a la Pila Bautismal, recordándonos que por el bautismo estamos destinados a la resurrección en la paz de Dios. Y ahora, continuamos nuestro camino diario en la vida de la Iglesia con la temporada del Tiempo Ordinario.

De innumerables maneras he experimentado la historia divina de esperanza y paz de manera ordinaria con nuestro extraordinario pueblo de Dios. Aprovecho este momento para agradecerte a ti y a los muchos que han compartido tu viaje e historia conmigo. Este 30 de mayo celebraré mis Bodas de Plata como sacerdote de Jesucristo. Tenga en cuenta que la paz interior y la confianza que ha compartido en su testimonio de la fe me ha moldeado de muchas maneras extraordinarias. Me gustaría compartir con ustedes algunos de los años formativos de mi sacerdocio.

1998-2002 fue una época de sentar las bases como sacerdote recién ordenado en Our Lady of Peace, North Hills. Tuve la oportunidad de simplemente probar cosas nuevas y estar abierto a nuevos comienzos. Estos años fueron libres de administración y llenos de nuevas experiencias. Tantos ofrecieron palabras de aliento: ¡tómense su tiempo! Todavía estás creciendo, y antes de que te des cuenta, serás mejor en esto o aquello. Esta seguridad me llevó adelante y me permitió ser libre.

2002-2018 fue una época de tantos nuevos descubrimientos. Llegué a St. Anthony's, Long Beach como asociado y, antes de darme cuenta, estaba involucrado en la administración. Hubo tantos momentos de cuestionamiento: ¿y si? ¿Quizás debería dar un paso atrás? ¿Cómo puedo liderar? ¡Soy muy joven! Bueno, Señor, aquí estoy. Vengo a hacer tu voluntad. Estos años notables también fueron tiempos de muchas pérdidas personales: mi padre, mi madre y mi sobrino. Estas pérdidas me moldearon para conocer y apreciar la vida de una manera diferente. Aprendí a hablar menos en los funerales ya testimoniar más en silencio. En medio de tiempos difíciles en el ministerio y la administración, la experiencia de la gracia de Dios y muchos momentos llenos de fe me dieron la fuerza para la misión.

2018-Presente ha sido un tiempo de búsqueda: Señor, ¿cuál es tu misión para mí en St. Charles? ¡Lo he preguntado muchas veces! Y como nos recuerda el Evangelio de hoy, seguía escuchando las palabras: "Tened paz, Dios proveerá". Este ha sido mi nuevo mantra y lema. Poco sabía, Covid también traería luchas y tristezas significativas a lo largo del viaje. A pesar de todo, la paz me ha reforzado a lo largo de mi camino aquí en St. Charles. Perder a mi hermano y a mi cuñado junto con tantos que murieron durante la pandemia marcó mi alma. Cuanto más luché con tantas ideas y nuevas formas de ministerio, entrando en otro capítulo de mi vida, más escuché las palabras de Jesús: La paz sea contigo.

Reflexionando sobre esta paz, sé de dónde viene. Sé cómo ir hacia él, en vulnerabilidad y apertura. Está en la Eucaristía. Es con el pueblo de Dios. Es con mi familia que me quiere y me apoya. Es con mi fraternidad extendida de sacerdotes. Se encuentra entre las religiosas dedicadas y santas, los diáconos y con el pueblo de Dios. Incluso cuando hablamos idiomas diferentes, como nos recuerda hoy el libro de los Hechos, somos capaces de comunicarnos en el lenguaje del amor a través de la Eucaristía. La presencia de Dios en el momento presente y en la Eucaristía me concede la gracia de simplemente estar en paz sabiendo con certeza que Dios proveerá.

Sigamos orando y estando ahí los unos para los otros en la Eucaristía. Porque sin el Señor, pasamos hambre y sed. Él es nuestro alimento y nuestra guía. Con el Señor podemos salir y no tener miedo. En esta confianza y paz, espero con gran anhelo los próximos 25 años de sacerdocio ministerial en Jesucristo. Estad seguros de mi amor y mis oraciones por todos vosotros, ya que sigo siendo vuestro hermano, tío, amigo, pastor, sacerdote y, sobre todo, compañero de camino.

2. PRAY

Today's Gospel is short but very powerful. In the Gospel, we hear about the beginning of our Church. We hear about the giving of the gift of the Holy Spirit from the Father, God, through His son, Jesus Christ to us, the people of God. During your prayer time today, call on the Holy Spirit to be with you. Allow the power of the Holy Spirit to be present in your life.

Ask Jesus to help you remove anything in your heart that prevents you from being His missionary disciple. Ask Jesus to give you the courage to be open to serve Him without hesitation or fear. Pray that the peace you give to others is also the peace you experience each and every day in your own heart and in your life.

As a family or individually, take a moment to listen and reflect on this song [HERE](#). When finished, invite your family to pray together:

O Father of goodness, we thank you for the great gift of your Spirit, which descends upon us by the breath of your beloved Son, to strengthen us in the moments when we need it most.

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

Help us, with your power, to open the doors that fear makes us close tightly, and thus, with the impulse of your Spirit, we can be messengers of the gospel, to every person I will come across this week. We ask this for your Son Jesus Christ who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.



3. TALK

Invite a family member or friend to reflect with you on the following questions:

- When in your life have you locked yourself away from family or friends because you were fearful of how they may judge you for some decisions you have made in your life?
- Do you allow yourself to be vulnerable enough to ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to help you conquer your fears?
- When have you had a profound Holy Spirit experience that changed your life in a positive way?

After your reflection time, share with your family/friend on one of the reflection questions. After sharing your response, together pray the Responsorial Psalm response: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." Amen

Family challenge: considering today's Gospel, this week we will be attentive to all the different voices of the Holy Spirit that I hear and call me.

- If there is someone to reconcile with, it is time to approach him or her, to forgive or to be forgiven.
- Think of someone you can visit or accompany during the week, and bring "something" that represents and communicates to him or her the coming of the Holy Spirit.


