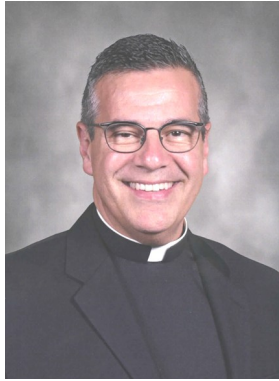

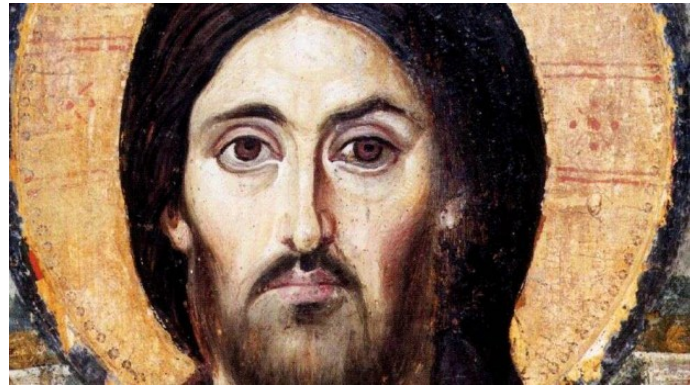
"Help me/us to discern if this is a Cross that we must carry, or is this a bag of heavy rocks that someone is asking us to carry for them?"

The *VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children™* program educates and trains adults (clergy, religious, teachers, staff, volunteers, and parents) about the dangers of sexual abuse, the warning signs of abuse, the ways to prevent abuse, the methods of properly reporting suspicions of abuse, and responding to allegations of abuse. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles mandates all clergy, staff, whether paid or volunteer, and all volunteers who work in any capacity with or around children, the elderly, or people with special needs to complete the initial three-hour *VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children for Adults™* program. St. Charles is offering Confirmation preparation for high school students and for adults who have already received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Holy Communion. Confirmation Information and registration is available at www.SCB-Confirmation.com.



Teen Confirmation

Teen Confirmation is a two-year program for high school students, typically in grades 9/10 or 10/11. To prepare the teens for Confirmation, we will have two sessions per month, one Zoom on a weekday and one in-person on Sunday morning at St. Charles. In addition, the teens are expected to attend the Sunday 11:00 am mass at St. Charles with their families at least twice per month and perform service for the parish community. The Year 1 program will begin September 24, and the Year 2 program will begin October 4.

Adult Confirmation

This process is for adults over the age of 18 who have already been baptized and received First Holy Communion who desire to complete the Sacraments of Initiation and desire to be Confirmed in the Catholic Church. 2. PRAY

In the Gospel today, we hear Jesus say, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me...." Close your eyes and imagine Jesus is sitting next to you and he tells you this same phrase. Jesus is not saying that carrying your cross will be easy.



Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

As you are talking with Jesus, name the burdens or troubles you are carrying right now. Imagine Jesus freely taking on your burdens with you. As you pray with Jesus, ask him for the strength and courage to help you release this heavy load from your heart and soul. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you the gifts of wisdom, fortitude and piety to believe in the freedom and peace that we thirst for in our lives. As you conclude your time in prayer with Jesus, thank Him for His Divine presence in your life. Close your prayer time by reciting the Responsorial Psalm, "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God!".



3. TALK

Reflect on a time in your life when you felt like the cross you were carrying seemed too hard to bear? How was Jesus able to overcome and remove that heavy burden and make it feel lighter or more bearable? What are some things you need to "let go of" that hamper you from being a true follower of Christ?

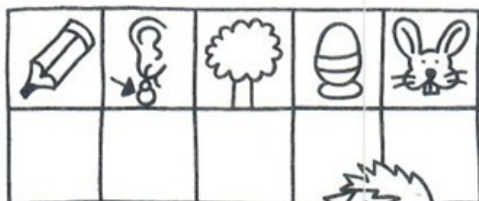

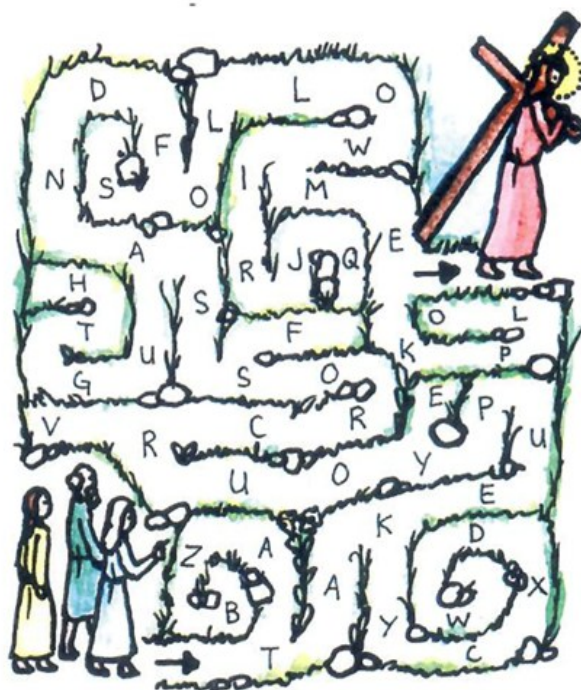
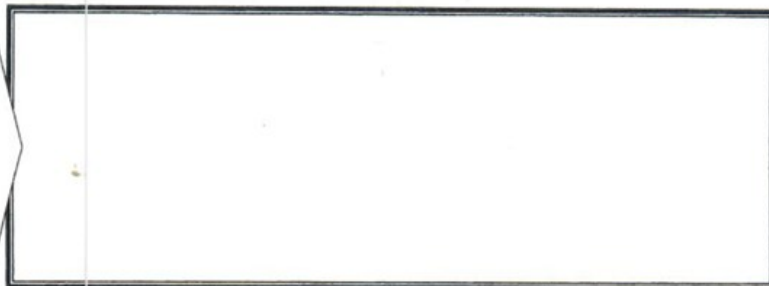

- Toiletries: toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, soap, etc.
- Basic clothing for all ages, clean, and free of negative slogans and sexual innuendo
- Bedlinens (marked by size), towels, clean and free of holes and stains
- Household items and toys, clean, in working order, and with all their parts and pieces.
- Books, mostly novels with great plots and action, or children's books
- Backpacks, duffel bags, shopping bags, paper grocery bags
- Infant and adult diapers, moist wipes in medium or smaller packages

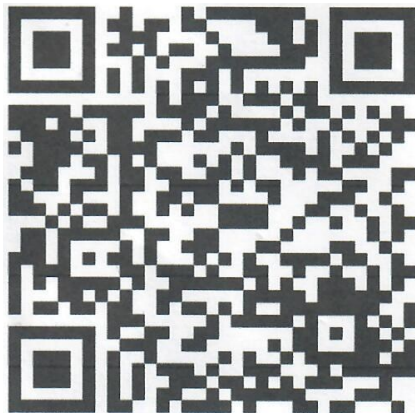

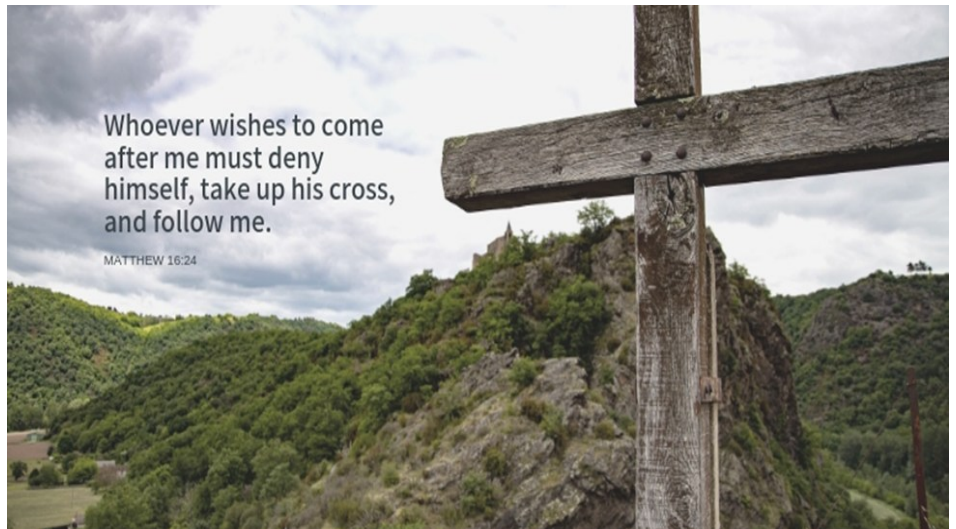
