


OCTOBER 1, 2023 # THE TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - A Benefits of the Eucharist

Holy Communion augments our union with Christ.

Jesus told us: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. [John 6:56] Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." [John 6:57] Our growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the end of our lives

+ Holy Communion separates us from sin.

- The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins.
- As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens our charity, which tends to be weakened in daily life; and this living charity wipes away venial sins. [St. Ambrose; 1 Cor 11:26] The more we share the life of Christ and progress in his friendship, the more difficult it is to break away from him by serious sin.
- The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church.
- Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism. The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." [1 Cor. 10:16-17]
- The Eucharist commits us to the poor.
- "You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognize your brother,... You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal... God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful." [St. John Chrysostom]
- The Eucharist and the unity of Christians.
- We fervently pray for the unity of the Christian Churches which accept and participate in the Eucharist over the centuries. We long for the ultimate unity which is in full participation together in the Eucharist.

As we continue discerning the call to Renew our understanding of the Eucharist, I want to thank each of you for listening and taking to heart the invitation to be renewed. This week we have our second week of discernment and prayer about the Eucharist.

The Gospel today challenges us to listen to the Lord and follow His Ways. It is not only in the listening to approach the Altar and be nourished, but in approaching the Altar and receiving and being nourished that we find the Lord. Let us discern how to best prepare and act upon the invitation to receive the Eucharist. Let us also continue being open to the Grace of the Holy Spirit

guiding us to the Eucharist.

The two examples of the two sons are so on point as we listen and receive! AMEN!

Teen Confirmation



2. PRAY

Ask Jesus what he would like you to do differently. Listen for his response.

Talk with Jesus about all that he showed you during your prayer. Ask him for whatever grace you need to do the Father's will more fully.

Thank Jesus for this time together.

3. TALK

Following God's will leads us to the kingdom of God. Yet, there are times when we struggle to obey God. We don't always follow His way, even after saying we will do so. Sometimes we need to make intentional changes and even receive support or help from other people so we can become more obedient to God.

- How can your family (or friend) support you or help you in this commitment?



EARTHQUAKE in MOROCCO

The impact of the quake was felt as far north as Casablanca, though its epicenter was in the High Atlas Mountains, where hard-to-reach communities suffered the most severe damage. **More**

than 300,000 people are affected and at least 2,490 were killed. Access to remote areas with the worst destruction—especially in mountain towns—remains difficult.

The global Caritas community, including CRS, is supporting Caritas Rabat with meeting both urgent, lifesaving needs, as well as with long-term recovery. Priorities are likely to include:

- Emergency safe shelter.
- Food.
- Clean water and hygiene supplies.
- Living supplies such as blankets and kitchen wares.
- Support for medical assistance and counseling.
- Plans for the support of longerterm recovery for homes, infrastructure and livelihoods.
