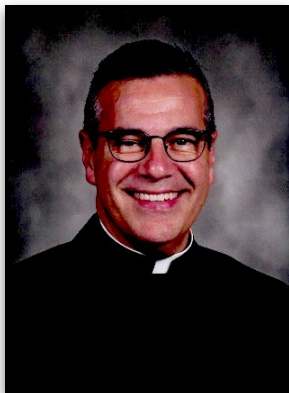

## *From the desk of Father José*

Jesus was put on the spot today in our Gospel. The question about paying taxes is too familiar, for sure. He did not answer by taking sides, but by clarifying that God is above it all. And therefore, one must be a good citizen because one is also trying to be a better Christian. The particulars of this Gospel can be very familiar to so many of the present day issues confronting our global family.

It was not too long ago that I was talking to a family in our parish parking lot which clarified the complexity of simply listening and being attentive to the issue at hand. There was a situation where a decision was locked-in and both parties were not moving not even a millimeter. So here I come with my cup of coffee... and I get asked, "Father what do you think...?" And I simply prayed for a quick second and asked the Holy Spirit to guide me and all I could say was, "Let us take a step back, pray about it, and sleep on the issue. If next day we have to meet, I suggest we do, but pray first."

As I write this bulletin, I am praying we may take time to listen to each other in difficult and complex issues – especially with our families, work situations, and political views.

Come Holy Spirit and guide us!

## 2. PRAY

In today's Gospel, we hear how the disciples of the Pharisees approached Jesus, along with the Herodians. Herodians were a Jewish sect that collaborated with the Romans, and thus compromised their Jewish heritage of observance of the Law. Pharisees were a Jewish sect who were very scrupulous in their observance of the Law. The question they asked of Jesus was intended to inflame the ongoing conflict and division among these groups. Jesus' response avoided the trap and pointed to a better, unifying option.

Division and conflict are prominent parts of our current realities, and we often feel there is no choice but to take sides.

Ask Jesus to show you where and how you personally have contributed to creating conflict and division. Talk with Jesus about the realities he has shown you.

Jesus calls us, as his disciples, to bring about unity and stop creating division. Ask Jesus to show you how he wants you to respond to this call. Take some time to listen for his response.

Close this prayer time by reciting this litany.

For the times I have been a source of division... Forgive me, Jesus!  
For the times when I have created conflict...  
For the times I have been deaf to the concerns of others...  
For the times I have been blind to the needs of others...

For the courage to bridge the gap... Jesus, help me!  
For the wisdom to foster peace...  
For the gentleness of heart to hear the concerns of the other...  
For the humility to serve the needs of the other...

2. How can you respond to Jesus' call to be a source of unity?

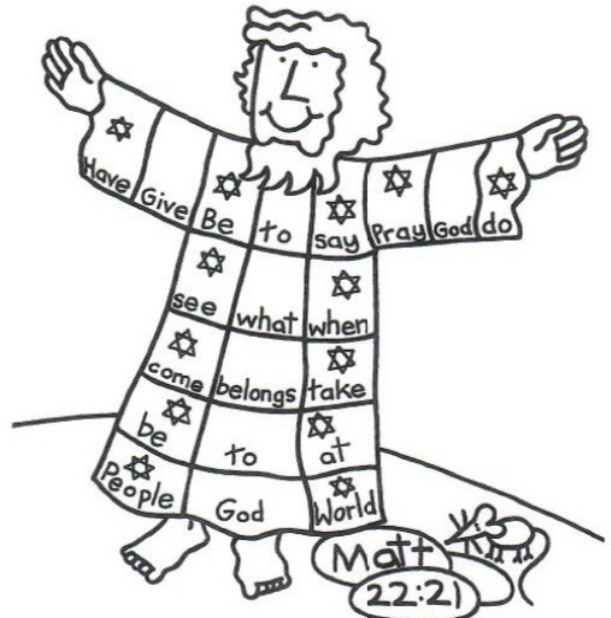

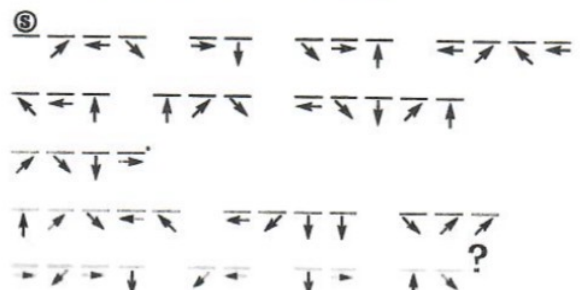

## READINGS for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Lectionary 145

### Glory to God

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, We give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King.
