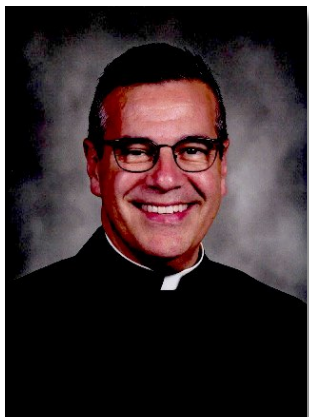

1. HEAR

Grab your bible and look up the Gospel reading. Don't have one? No worries you can find the Gospel reading by clicking [HERE](#).

The children can also watch a video proclamation of the Gospel adapted to children by clicking [HERE](#). (YouTube, Holy Heroes, 1:29 min)

2. TALK

Gather the family in a room and ask each person to remember a time when they felt God or Jesus were asking them to do something special for others. For example, help someone in need, or make a life-changing decision, or to reconcile with someone they had previously had a disagreement with, etc.

Allow each adult and young person to briefly share with the rest of the family their story. Once everyone has shared, ask the two questions we provide next.

1. What feelings filled your heart as you were doing what God/Jesus asked you to do?
2. What feelings filled your heart after you had done what they asked of you?

Allow time for each person to answer at least one of the questions.

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @OREinADLA on social media.

Note: If you have children, ask them to imagine how they think Jesus is calling them to be near to him. If desired, they can draw a picture and then show it to the rest of the family.

3. PRAY

Today's Gospel tells us the story of how Jesus called his first disciples. A disciple is someone who listens and follows the teachings of Jesus to live a happy life. All Christians have been called to be disciples of Jesus from our baptism, including children, as we heard in the reading from the Book of Samuel.



Create a family prayer space at home by placing a Bible, a crucifix, a candle, and a small bowl with water. (*You may consider asking the children in your household to help put the prayer space together.*) Gather your family around the prayer space, and if possible, light the candle. (*You may use a battery-operated candle if necessary.*)

An adult in the family reads the following litany and invites all others to join in the response.

Leader: Lord, we have heard your call to be your disciples!

All: Lord, come and live with us.

Leader: Lord, you call us to learn from you!

All: Lord, come and live with us.

Leader: Lord, you ask us to listen to your living Word!

All: Lord, come and live with us.

Leader: Lord, you ask us to serve you in our brother and sisters!

All: Lord, come and live with us.

Leader: Lord, today we offer our lives to you!

All: Lord, come and live with us.

Next, that same adult who led the litany prayer takes the bowl of water from the prayer space, wets his/her thumb in the water, and proceeds to make the sign of the cross on the forehead of each member present. Each person who is signed with the water responds "Amen".

To conclude this time of prayer, all recite the "Glory be..."

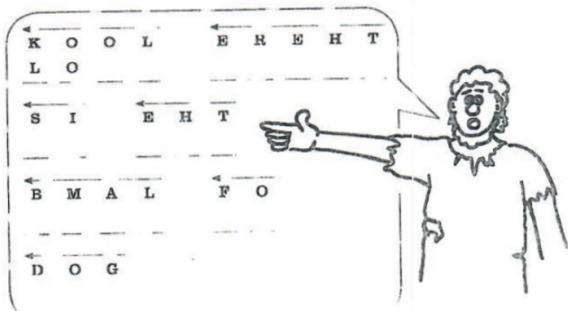

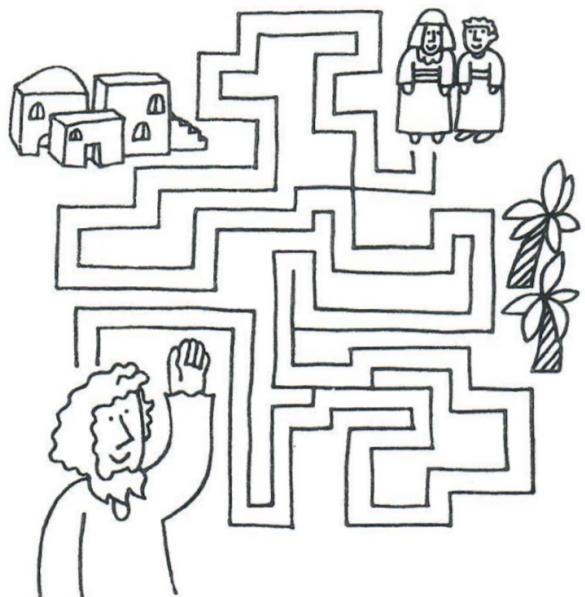

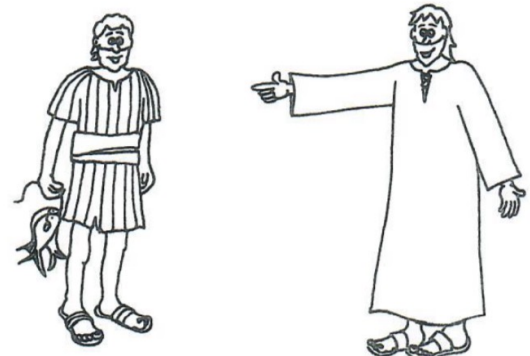

READINGS for the 2nd SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME - Lectionary 65

Glory to God

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, We give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King. O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Reading 1 - 1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

How to actively listen to abuse disclosures

Disclosing abuse is one of the hardest — and most important — steps for a victim to take. If a child chooses to tell you about abuse, make sure you are actively listening. Give the child all of your attention and listen calmly, without making judgements or assumptions. Listen patiently without filling in the blanks or making suggestions. The best thing is for the child to tell his or her own story. Ask limited questions, and only for information needed to report abuse.
