




In today's first reading from Leviticus, we hear about the unclean person, and what that person needed to do when in public.



2. PRAY

Lepers were unclean and separated from all other people. In today's Gospel, the leper approached Jesus and confidently showed Jesus his full self, trusting that Jesus could make him clean.

What do you need to ask Jesus to make clean in you? In your prayer go to Jesus, kneel before Him and beg Him, "If you wish, you can make me clean". Listen to what Jesus says to you.

3. TALK

St. Paul reminds us to be imitators of Christ and to do everything for the Glory of God. In the Gospel we see Jesus take a risk in reaching out and touching the leper. We, too, can choose to be the love of God, a source of healing and compassion, or we can choose to keep our distance and stay safe.

When have you encountered a person in need of love, healing, compassion and were hesitant to respond? What risk were you concerned about? What choice did you make? Did your choice imitate Christ?

As you look towards the beginning of lent this coming Wednesday, what can you do this season of lent to make choices that more closely imitate Christ? In your prayer how can you continue begging Jesus to make you clean?




