

From the desk of Father José

Today in our Gospel we continue the theme of authenticity in prayer! In our parable we are given two very different approaches to prayer and judgment.

The Pharisee would be someone who follows the law and tries his best, but in this case, goes beyond trying to be good on the outside. On the inside he is being judgmental of others —especially the ones who are broken. As for the tax collector, he knows he has done wrong and is not even able to lift his eyes in prayer.

- What do we learn about prayer from these two very different approaches?
- When I pray, do I allow myself to be led by routine... attitudes from others about what I am doing?
- When I pray do I seek to be comforted by the mercy of God, recognizing that I am a sinner, and that I need his infinite mercy?

Let us approach the altar as our most authentic selves. It will, for sure, fluctuate according to our journey. What remains constant is the mercy of God and our need to approach the altar with all our being.



READINGS for the THIRTIETH SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME - Lectionary 150

Reading 1 - Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

The LORD is a God of justice, who knows no favorites. Though not unduly partial toward the weak, yet he hears the cry of the oppressed. The Lord is not deaf to the wail of the orphan, nor to the widow when she pours out her complaint. The one who serves God willingly is heard; his petition reaches the heavens. The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw till the Most High responds, judges justly and affirms the right, and the Lord will not delay.

Gospel - Luke 18:9-14

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

VIRTUS[®] PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN *Who is a mandated reporter?*

A mandated reporter is someone who is required to report suspected or disclosed cases of abuse to child protective services or law enforcement including a wide range of persons from teachers, educators, coaches, to school and parish staff, and clergy. The mandated report may involve concerns about possible abuse or neglect in the child's home or by a family member. At a school or parish, if the person making a report believes that child abuse or neglect is the case then the person should make the report to the local law enforcement agency, which has the resources and ability to intervene immediately if needed. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles urges all in our church to speak up to the appropriate authorities if any form of child abuse is suspected. 


