The second reading for today begins a five-week series of selections from James, a letter that is classified among the so-called "catholic" (or universal) epistles because they are addressed to a general audience rather than to one particular community. Today's text offers important advice for Christians of every generation. God is first cited as the author of all gifts, and in particular, reference is made to the gift of baptism by which we have been made the "first fruits" of the new creation. What follows is advice based on a very Jewish understanding of the "word" as an active force, operative in the world. We are reminded that unless we, too, become "doers" of the word, our claim to faith is empty. Today and in subsequent weeks the author reminds us that it is equally important to do the "works" of love, for example, by caring for the "orphans and widows in their affliction."

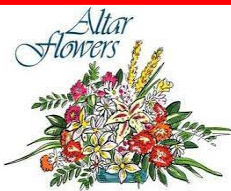
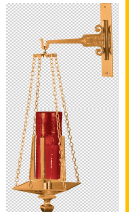

Sunday Gospel Reflections From Bishop Parkes

A clean and humble heart and soul



“So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” – Mark 7:5

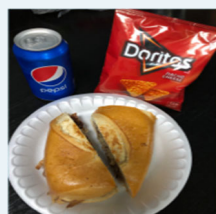
I remember attending a workshop for pastors and bishops on leadership. One of my key takeaways from the conference was to make an effort to catch people doing something right. As bishop, you can imagine that I receive many letters and emails about our parishes, priests and deacons. Some express concerns or bad experiences that they had. Others want to let me know how much their faith has grown because of their involvement at a particular parish. Could you imagine if I only called or contacted the priest or pastor when I received a complaint, but never when I heard something positive? I’ve made it a practice to do both – to call when something needs to be addressed, and to say thank you when praise is deserved. Do you do the same, or are you always looking to catch someone doing something wrong?

Mark’s Gospel this weekend deals with the Pharisees who are judging Jesus’ followers based on the fact that they don’t follow the traditional ritualistic practices of the elders with respect to purification and cleanliness. The Pharisees are more concerned with the external, but over time, the ritual had lost its meaning and despite being outwardly clean, their hearts were not so clean. Jesus observes that they do one thing that is righteous but then do something else that is sinful. They have the outward appearance of cleanliness and righteousness, but inwardly, the disposition of their hearts is not pure.



This is a lesson for all of us. Many attend Mass and go through the rituals of blessings, gestures and pious appearances. But do we even know the meaning behind them or why we do them? Many receive the Holy Eucharist and yet have an unclean heart as they have not been to the Sacrament of Reconciliation in years. We are called to approach the altar, and Jesus in the Eucharist, with reverence and awe, and not in a state of sin or out of obligation. Not only should our outward appearance be respectful when approaching the Lord’s table, but more importantly, our heart and soul should be clean and humble.

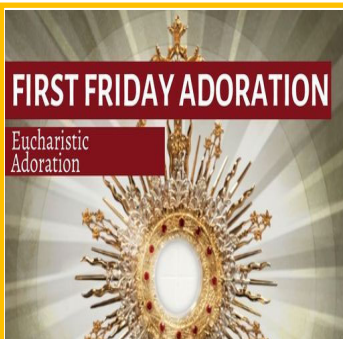

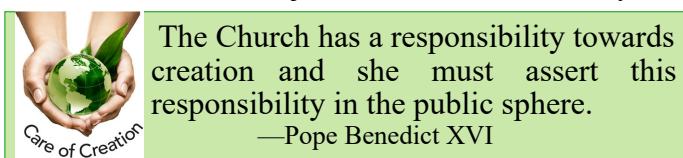
This year, our diocese has assigned Rev. Fr. Claudius Mganga who is recently the *Parochial Vicar* of Our Lady of Fatima Parish, Inverness.



He will talk about the works & needs of the Archdiocese of Mwanza, Tanzania which covers an area of 19,592 sq. km (7,362 sq. miles). It is situated in Northwestern Tanzania. The head of the Metropolitan of the Lake Zone.

1. SEMINARIANS/VOCATIONS - The diocese is constantly catering for the formation of future priests. Right now, we have 102 Seminarians who need a support to cover on accommodation, tuition, and transport costs. The widespread poverty in Tanzania is affecting our capability to accept more vocations to our seminaries due to lack of resources. Your donation will help to train and ordain more priests to minister to our people and indeed sent others as missionaries to you.
2. ORPHANS - It is the greatest need. This is due to the growing number of Orphans as a result of HIV/AIDS, and other diseases or natural death. They need their basic daily living like Health care, Education, on which right now we are paying school fees of about \$ 600.00 for 150 children which is almost 50 dollars per month, keeping orphans at school is crucial for their future, as education provides a safety net in a child's life and schooling also helps break the cycle of poverty. Children are empowered by regarding themselves as active members of a community rather than just victims. We also provide religious and moral training and loving support by caregivers.
3. WATER - Our people have gone through difficult and hard stages in their survival through the years. Our diocese is assisting in the provision of safe water in the rural areas for domestic use and livestock through self-help initiatives.
4. EDUCATION; GIRLS' SECONDARY SCHOOL - On education program, we also focus on helping paying for secondary school tuition and fees for those adolescent girls from poor families whose parents might otherwise arrange a marriage in order to receive the bride price from the groom and his family.

Please be generous in helping our brothers and sisters who are in dire need of our assistance. Thank you.

Reflexiones del Evangelio Dominical del Obispo Parkes

Un corazón y una alma limpia y humilde



“Los fariseos y los escribas le preguntaron: «¿Por qué tus discípulos comen con manos impuras y no siguen la tradición de nuestros mayores?»” - Marcos 7, 5

Recuerdo haber asistido a un taller para párrocos y obispos sobre liderazgo. Una de las principales ideas que me llevé de la conferencia fue que había que esforzarse por sorprender a las personas haciendo algo bien. Como obispo, te puedes imaginar que recibo muchas cartas y correos electrónicos sobre nuestras parroquias, sacerdotes y diáconos. Algunas personas expresan preocupaciones o malas experiencias que han tenido. Otras personas quieren hacerme saber cuánto ha crecido su fe gracias a su participación en su parroquia. ¿Te imaginas si sólo llamara o contactara al sacerdote o el párroco cuando recibo quejas, pero nunca cuando escucho algo positivo? He adoptado la costumbre de hacer ambas cosas: llamar cuando algo debe ser atendido y dar las gracias cuando el elogio es merecido. ¿Haces tú lo mismo o siempre buscas sorprender a alguien haciendo algo mal?

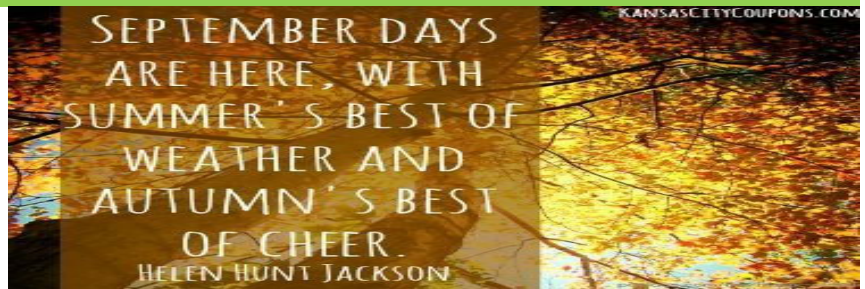
El Evangelio de san Marcos de este fin de semana trata sobre los fariseos que juzgan a los seguidores de Jesús porque no practican los rituales tradicionales de los mayores con respecto a la purificación y la limpieza. Los fariseos se preocupan más por lo externo, pero con el tiempo, el ritual perdió su significado y a pesar de estar limpios por fuera, no estaban igual de limpios sus corazones. Jesús observa que por un lado hacen una cosa que es justa pero por otro lado hacen otra cosa que es pecaminosa. Tienen la apariencia externa de limpieza y rectitud, pero interiormente, la condición de sus corazones no es pura.

Esta es una lección para todos nosotros. Muchas personas asisten a la Misa y cumplen con los rituales de las bendiciones, los gestos y las apariencias piadosas. Pero ¿saben siquiera su significado o por qué los realizan? Muchas personas reciben la Sagrada Eucaristía y sin embargo, tienen el corazón impuro porque llevan años sin acudir al sacramento de la Reconciliación. Somos llamados a acercarnos al altar y a Jesús en la Eucaristía, con reverencia y admiración y no en estado de pecado o por obligación. No basta con que nuestra apariencia externa muestre respeto al acercarnos a la mesa del Señor; es más importante que nuestro corazón y alma estén limpios y sean humildes.
