

"HE ALONE IS LORD"

In the scriptures, being anointed usually meant you were a prophet or king of Israel. So why is Cyrus given that title? Cyrus was king of Persia when the Babylonians held the people of Israel captive. God used him to defeat the Babylonians and eventually bring the Israelites back to their homes.

One thing this tells us is that God can work through anyone, not just saints and religious. Any time someone does a good deed, God is behind it. Just as God used Cyrus to free the Israelites from their Babylonian captivity, God can use governments to protect the poor, to help rebuild after disasters, or to defend freedom.

In that sense, we can understand what Jesus says about payment to Caesar and to God. Since everything belongs to God, that should be our first allegiance. But when God works through governments, we can give some support to them, by such activities as voting or paying taxes. Let us ask God to work through us also, helping us to proclaim that God alone is LORD. Tom Schmidt






Discipleship through Stewardship and Sacrificial Giving

Greetings and love. I am Fr. Theo Weria, ALCP, a Parochial Vicar at St. Cecelia parish, Clearwater -Florida, and a member

of the Apostolic Life Community of Priests (ALCP/OSS). I write this information to facilitate this year Mission Co-Operation Plan given to the Apostolic Life Community of Priests (ALCP/OSS)-Africa. I will speak at your church at all masses on the weekend of 28th and 29th of October 2023, for the benefit of the mission work run by the Apostolic Life Community of Priests in Tanzania, Africa.



As of 2023, ALCP Africa province has 125 members who minister mostly in the parishes in Africa, Germany, Italy, the United States of America, and Canada. In Africa, ALCP members minister in the formation of the members (seminarians and member priests), in the parishes, in the missions, the pastoral care for the sick and seniors; ministry to the social services for the poor and less fortunate people (health care centers, education to pre-schools, grade school, high schools, vocational school).



ALCP support and run these mission works, but cannot meet all the needs. This year, we a have a great need to formation and support our 75 Seminarians. We come to you asking for your support so as we continue to serve God's people. We ask and appeal to you for prayers and financial support. Whatever gift you share or offer will greatly be appreciated, and will

make much difference in our mission work. We pray and wish you and your family all the best in whatever you do in your life.


We are looking forward to great turnout for the November Market on the 4th. This is the time when

Notes from the August 31 Parish Pastoral Council meeting

Six families registered in the parish during July, bringing the total thus far for the year to 33 compared to 29 last year.

Twenty-five children are registered in Faith Formation classes with five more in the process of registering.

The autism support group met first on September 5 and plans to meet the first Tuesday of the month for about an hour.

Coffee & Conversation started September 16 and will continue the first and third Sundays of each month.

The Youth Group will meet on first Wednesdays at Our Lady of Grace and on third Wednesdays at St. Scholastica.

Mass celebrating the 60th anniversary of the parish will be at 11 a.m. October 13, 2024. A reception will follow. The event is being organized by a 60th Anniversary committee headed by Lori Cleaver.

A Morning of Reflection on August 19 associated with the National Eucharistic Revival's Year of the Parish was successful with more than 20 attending. Father Erwin would like to replicate it for lay ministers to increase their understanding of the Eucharist.

A new study from the National Eucharistic Revival committee, called *Jesus and the Revival*, will be offered to the parish free of charge. Mary Arnold and Mylene Taylor are planning it for Our Lady of Grace. The time will be this fall or Lent.

Presentation of *Eucharist Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence*, a video by Bishop Robert Barron, is being planned for November 18 or January 20. It will be mandatory for all lay ministers.

Pat D'Souza shared her experience as a 10-year-old when her mother took her to watch Saint Mother Teresa and her sisters working with the destitute in the streets of Calcutta (now Kolkata).

The next issue of *News from the Pews* will be mailed in early October. It remains open as to whether to continue this quarterly parish newsletter or to discontinue it with the coming of the quarterly diocesan *Gulf Coast Catholic* magazine.

Mylene Taylor make 10 copies of *Why They Follow* available to members of the pastoral council and others who want it. The book is about communicating effectively.

Father Erwin would like to schedule a pre-Christmas celebration following Vespers in early December. Permit applications for the church renovation were "hung up" in the county system but now are in an expedited lane.








En las Escrituras, ser ungido generalmente significaba que eras un profeta o rey de Israel. Entonces, ¿por qué se le da a Ciro ese título? Ciro era rey de Persia cuando los babilonios tenían cautivo al pueblo de Israel. Dios lo usó para derrotar a los babilonios y finalmente traer a los israelitas de regreso a sus hogares.

Una cosa que esto nos dice es que Dios puede obrar a través de cualquier persona, no solo de los santos y los religiosos. Cada vez que alguien hace una buena obra, Dios está detrás de ella. Así como Dios usó a Ciro para liberar a los israelitas de su cautiverio en Babilonia, Dios puede usar a los gobiernos para proteger a los pobres, ayudar a reconstruir después de los desastres o defender la libertad.

En ese sentido, podemos entender lo que dice Jesús sobre el pago al César y a Dios. Dado que todo pertenece a Dios, esa debe ser nuestra primera lealtad. Pero cuando Dios obra a través de los gobiernos, podemos brindarles un apoyo mediante actividades como votar o pagar impuestos. Pidámosle a Dios que actúe también a través de nosotros, ayudándonos a proclamar que sólo Dios es Señor.
