



This is Revival

"The coming of Jesus at Bethlehem brought joy to the world and to every human heart. The same Jesus comes again and again in our hearts during Holy Communion. He wants to give the same joy and peace...Let us pray much for this grace of peace and joy in our own heart, in our communities, in our society and in the Church" (St. Teresa of Calcutta).

PRAYER

"God of power and mercy, open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy, so that we may share his wisdom when he comes in glory." Amen.

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

Saint Peter shows us a characteristic of God that we normally do not think about. He tells us that for God, "a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day" (2 Peter 3:8). Because early Christians sometimes complained that Jesus' second coming had been delayed, Peter is trying to tell us that what seems like a long time to us is nothing to God.

Like the early Christians, we may wonder how long it will take for God to answer our prayers. We may be praying for someone who is looking for a job, a sick relative, an end to abortion, or world peace. Some prayers require us to change, and we may not be ready.

What Peter means is that a thousand years is not too long for God if someone needs that long to repent. God is far more patient than we are. God has been "waiting" over two thousand years for us to preach the gospel to all nations. God has been waiting for millennia for people to give up war as a means for solving our problems. God has been waiting since the beginning of the human race for us to learn how to love our neighbor.

We might not be as patient as God, but we can help. Saint Peter says that we are not just waiting for the Lord's return, we are hastening it. When we make a choice that is based on faith rather than selfishness, we make it a little easier for people to believe in God. Jesus is the light of the world; he asks us to let our light shine, so that people can see Jesus in us. May our light "prepare the way of the Lord" (Mark 1:3).

As Catholics, we are called to respect life from conception until natural death. We are also called to put our faith into action.

Abortion is one of the most pernicious practices in our nation today. But why...why is it so harmful and destructive? The secular or worldly answer is abortion ends a life. Every one of us is living proof that abortion kills. For, if we were aborted in the womb, we would not be here. Few things in this world are more self-evident than that. Yet, the problem with abortion runs deeper for Catholics and our Catholic faith. Abortion strikes at the very foundation of our faith and the bedrock of our church – what we believe. We profess what we believe in every mass when we say the Nicene Creed. Among the beliefs, we profess, "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son...." It is the Holy Spirit that gives life. Abortion ends it. Abortion reverses the act of the Holy Spirit and overrules the will of God...willfully and deliberately. It ends a life and is destructive to the soul.

As Catholics, we are called to protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence – from conception to natural death. Each of us is also called to put our faith into action. So, what can you do to help end abortion?

<u>Pray.</u> You can pray for the end of abortion – the rosary, the Prayer for Life, or a prayer from your heart. <u>Sign the Signature Ad.</u> You can be a signatory on the upcoming Pro-Life advertisement in the Citrus County Chronicle that opposes abortion and remembers the 65,259,665 unborn babies lost to abortion in the US.

<u>Decline to Sign</u>. You can help spread the word to Decline to Sign the petition that would put a dangerous pro-abortion amendment on the Florida ballot in the November election. The call from the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops is shown below.

<u>Support Pro-Life Organizations</u>. You can volunteer, donate money, or contribute necessities to pro-life organizations that help those facing unplanned pregnancies or those that have chosen life.

Those are only a few examples of what you can do. If you search your heart, you will likely find more. No one can do everything, but everyone can do something. Put your faith into action.



Preparar el camino del Señor

San Pedro nos demuestra una característica de Dios que normalmente no consideramos. Nos dice que para Dios "un día es como mil años y mil años, como un día" (2 Pedro 3,8). Debido a que los primeros cristianos a veces se quejaban de que la segunda venida de Jesús se estaba demorando, Pedro está intentando decirnos que lo que a nosotros nos parece mucho tiempo no es nada para Dios.

Al igual que los primeros cristianos, podemos preguntarnos cuánto tiempo Dios va a demorar en responder a nuestras oraciones. Quizás estemos rezando por alguien que está buscando trabajo, un familiar enfermo, el fin del aborto o la paz mundial. Algunas oraciones requieren que nosotros cambiemos y puede ser que todavía no estemos dispuestos a hacerlo.

Lo que Pedro quiere decir es que mil años no es demasiado para Dios si alguien necesita ese tiempo para arrepentirse. Dios es mucho más paciente que nosotros. Dios ha estado "esperando" más de dos mil años para que prediquemos el e vangelio a todas las naciones. Dios ha estado esperando durante milenios a que la gente abandone la guerra como un remedio para resolver los problemas. Dios ha estado esperando desde el comienzo de la humanidad que aprendamos a amar al prójimo.

Puede ser que no seamos tan pacientes como Dios, pero podemos ayudar. San Pedro dice que no sólo estamos esperando que vuelva el Señor, sino que estamos acelerando su venida. Cuando tomamos una decisión basada en la fe en lugar del egoísmo, ayudamos a que sea un poco más fácil que las personas creen en Dios. Jesús es la luz del mundo y nos pide que dejemos brillar nuestra luz para que la gente pueda ver a Jesús en nosotros. Que nuestra luz "prepare[] el camino del Señor" (Marcos 1,3).
