

From Fr. Robert. . .

This Tuesday, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. This was Jesus's first visit to the temple, and the occasion is rich in significance for our faith. In the first temple, built by King Solomon, the ark of the covenant was placed in the central place of honor, the Holy of Holies. It was, for the Jewish people, the presence of God in their midst. Imagine their sadness when Solomon's temple was destroyed in 586 BC and the ark was lost forever. The temple was eventually rebuilt, but the ark was irreplaceable. When Jesus visited the temple, a new and better Ark came to the temple -- Mary, the New Ark of the New Covenant -- and she brought with her the true presence of God in the flesh, Jesus Christ. That is why Simeon and Anna were so ecstatic when Jesus came, because they knew God was restoring His dwelling among men, but to a degree beyond their imagining. That's why Simeon exclaimed, "Lord, now you let your servant go in peace. Your word has been fulfilled. My own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel" (Lk 2: 29-32). We have a temple in our own town in which the Light of the World resides, and it is a beautiful place of prayer. I was talking with a parishioner the other day who told me that, for a while, she was coming to the church every day to pray while her son was ill, but now that he's recovered she keeps coming daily because she found she likes it so much! May we all discover the peace and joy that quiet prayer with Jesus can bring to our hearts!

Este martes celebramos la Fiesta de la Presentación del Señor en el Templo. Esta fue la primera visita de Jesús al templo, y la ocasión es rica en significado para nuestra fe. En el primer templo, construido por el rey Salomón, el arca del pacto se colocó en el lugar central de honor, el Lugar Santísimo. Para el pueblo judío, era la presencia de Dios en medio de ellos. Imagínese su tristeza cuando el templo de Salomón fue destruido en el 586 a.C. y el arca se perdió para siempre. El templo fue finalmente reconstruido, pero el arca era insustituible. Cuando Jesús visitó el templo, un Arca nueva y mejor llegó al templo - María, el Arca Nueva del Nuevo Pacto - y trajo con ella la verdadera presencia de Dios en la carne, Jesucristo. Es por eso que Simeón y Ana estaban tan extasiados cuando Jesús vino, porque sabían que Dios estaba restaurando Su morada entre los hombres, pero en un grado más allá de su imaginación. Por eso Simeón exclamó: "Señor, ahora deja ir en paz a tu siervo. Tu palabra se ha cumplido. Mis propios oios han visto la salvación que has preparado a los ojos de todo pueblo: una luz para revelarte a las naciones y la gloria de tu pueblo Israel" (Lc 2:29-32). Tenemos un templo en nuestro propio pueblo en el que reside la Luz del Mundo, y es un hermoso lugar de oración. Estaba hablando con un feligrés el otro día que me dijo que, por un tiempo, ella venía a la iglesia todos los días a orar mientras su hijo estaba enfermo, pero ahora que se recuperó sigue viniendo todos los días porque descubrió que le gusta tanto. ¡mucho! ¡Que todos descubramos la paz y la alegría que la oración silenciosa con Jesús puede traer a nuestro corazón!
