

#### From Fr. Robert. . .

Last weekend we had the joy of celebrating the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven (I celebrated Mass at camp in the Snowy Range with my mom and my brother and his family)! I hope this feast was an opportunity for you to deepen your relationship with our Heavenly Mother, Mary. In the Church's logic of celebration, a great feast day like that should be savored for days. And when a Solemnity needs to be savored. the Church has historically declared an "octave", which is 8 days of celebration of a feast day. We still do that with the octaves of Christmas and Easter, but there used to be a lot more. A vestige of the mentality of the octave celebration still exists with the solemnity of the Assumption, insofar as on the eighth day after the Assumption, we celebrate the Queenship of Mary. Makes sense, right? Mary is taken into heaven, we savor the delight of that mystery for a while, and then celebrate her being crowned as gueen of heaven and earth. So this Sunday, the 22nd, is the feast of the Queenship of Mary. We meditate on these two realities often in the 4th and 5th Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary, and there is much spiritual benefit to be gleaned from this meditation. Mary, as gueen of heaven and earth, sees us, knows us, cares for us. She "distributes" the riches of God's kingdom to us in beautiful fashion. Our spiritual "governance" is in her hands, and when we entrust ourselves to her gentle rule, she leads us closer to the King of Kings. Just as the moon has no light of its own, but reflects the splendor of the sun, so Mary's splendorous beauty as queen is a reflection of the goodness, loveliness, and mercy of God. As we contemplate this mystery of God's goodness in crowning Mary as queen of heaven and earth, let us invoke her motherly intercession and pray that beautiful prayer in her honor which the church has prayed for centuries: Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.


El fin de semana pasado tuvimos la alegría de celebrar la Solemnidad de la Asunción de María al cielo (¡celebré la misa en el campamento en Snowy Range con mi mamá, mi hermano y su familia)! Espero que esta fiesta fue una oportunidad para profundiciar su relación con nuestra Madre Celestial, María. En la lógica de la celebración de la Iglesia, una gran fiesta como esa debe saborearse durante días. Y cuando es necesario saborear una solemnidad, la Iglesia históricamente ha declarado una "octava", que son 8 días de celebración de una fiesta. Todavía hacemos eso con las octavas de Navidad y Pascua, pero había muchas más. Un vestigio de la mentalidad de la celebración de la octava todavía existe con la solemnidad de la Asunción, en la medida en que en el octavo día después de la Asunción, celebramos el Reinado de María. Tiene sentido, ¿verdad? María es llevada al cielo, saboreamos el deleite de ese misterio por un tiempo, y luego celebramos su coronación como reina del cielo y de la tierra. Así que este domingo 22 es la fiesta del Reinado de María. Meditamos en estas dos realidades a menudo en el 4º y 5º Misterios Gloriosos del Rosario, y hay mucho beneficio espiritual que se puede extraer de esta meditación. María, como reina del cielo y de la tierra, nos ve, nos conoce, nos cuida. Ella nos "distribuye" las riquezas del reino de Dios de una manera hermosa. Nuestro "gobierno" espiritual está en sus manos, y cuando nos encomendamos a su gentil gobierno, ella nos acerca al Rey de Reyes. Así como la luna no tiene luz propia, sino que refleja el esplendor del sol, la esplendorosa belleza de María como reina es un reflejo de la bondad, la hermosura y la misericordia de Dios. Al contemplar este misterio de la bondad de Dios al coronar a María como reina del cielo y de la tierra, invoquemos su intercesión maternal y recemos esa hermosa oración en su honor que la Iglesia ha rezado durante siglos: Dios te salve, Reina santa, madre de misericordia, vida, nuestra dulzura y nuestra esperanza, a ti clamamos, pobres hijos desterrados de Eva. A ti enviamos nuestros suspiros lamentándonos y llorando en este valle de lágrimas. Vuele, pues, misericordioso abogado, tus oios de misericordia hacia nosotros, v después de este nuestro destierro, muéstranos el fruto bendito de tu vientre, Jesús. Oh clemente, oh amante, oh dulce Virgen María. Ruega por nosotros, Santa Madre de Dios, para que seamos dignos de alcanzar las promesas de Cristo.


