

From Fr. Robert. . .

Recently, soooo many people have asked me for prayers. There are many people in our community, our families, and our world who are sick, suffering, lonely, and lost. Many people are in need of our prayers and sacrifices. As Catholics, interceding for others is part of what it means to follow Christ. He calls us to be real mediators of His grace, and we cannot discount the power of our prayers and sacrifices. Little sacrifices or penances add power to our prayers. St. Paul says, "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church" (Col 1:24). Given all the people who need prayers for healing in body, mind, and soul, I want to share with you a prayer for healing which you can pray for yourself or for someone else:

"Lord Jesus, You came to heal our wounded and troubled hearts. I beg You to heal the torments that cause anxiety in my heart; I beg You, in a particular way, to heal all who are the cause of sin. I beg You to come into my life and heal me of the psychological harms that struck me in my early years and form the injuries that they caused throughout my life.

Lord Jesus, You know my burdens. I lay them all on Your Good Shepherd's Heart. I beseech You -- by the merits of the great, open wound in Your heart -- to heal the small wounds that are in mine. Heal the pain of my memories, so that nothing that has happened to me will cause me to remain in pain and anguish, filled with anxiety.

Heal, O Lord, all those wounds that have been the cause of all the evil that is rooted in my life. I want to forgive all those who have offended me. Look to those inner sores that make me unable to forgive. You Who came to forgive the afflicted of heart, please, heal my own heart.

Heal, my Lord Jesus, those intimate wounds that cause me physical illness. I offer You my heart. Accept it, Lord, purify it, and give me the sentiments of Your Divine Heart. Help me to be meek and humble.

Heal me, O Lord, from the pain caused by the death of my loved ones, which is oppressing me. Grant me to regain peace and joy in the knowledge that You are the Resurrection and the Life. Make me an authentic witness to Your Resurrection, Your victory over sin and death, Your living presence among us. Amen."

The Catholic Church has always been decidedly pro-life, and we as Catholics are called to do our part, even in the public square, to promote the dignity of all people, including promoting the legal protection of the unborn. There is an initiative currently underway in our local community that will further this cause. Please prayerfully consider supporting Dr. Amber Moss's petition to pass legislation making abortion illegal in Washakie County. She is hoping to have all signatures in by the first week of September. This initiative is not an underhanded way of endorsing a political party. Our involvement in this is a focus on the issue of the God-given right to life. Thank you. -Fr. Robert.


