From Fr. Robert. . .

Parish Mission: Built Upon the Rock

Fr. Greg Bramlage and his team will be in Worland in just one week to put on Level 2 of his parish mission on healing and deliverance (he'll preach at all the Masses next weekend both in Thermopolis and Worland). I am very excited for this year's mission. Last year's mission truly was transformative for me as a Catholic and as a priest. I encountered the Holy Spirit in a new way, and, since the mission, praying with people for healing has been such an enriching new dimension for my ministry. I've even witnessed miracles before my very eyes on account of it! This year, please don't leave your kids at home! Our young people urgently need to encounter the Love of God too! To help lay the groundwork for the upcoming mission, I want to share a couple paragraphs with you from the book *Healing*, by Dr. Mary Healy.

"In the biblical account of the first evangelization, one factor that is immediately obvious is the prominent role played by healings and other miraculous works of God. For Jesus and his first followers, the preaching of the good news was inseparable from the signs and wonders by which God himself corroborated the spoken message and convinced the hearers of its truth. As the letter to the Hebrews puts it, while Christians preached the word, "God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his own will" (Heb 2:4). Through these miracles done through faith in the name of Jesus, countless people personally witnessed Christ's power and came to believe in him.

"Are people today any less in need of an encounter with God than the people of the first century? In a world that has lost a sense of the transcendent, healings and miracles are all the more needed to demonstrate that God is the living God who acts in history and in human lives. They are a balm for the gaping spiritual wound in contemporary society: the wound of the absence of God. Healings convince even the most hardened and broken hearts that God has not left us orphans but is present and active and rich in mercy towards us. At the same time, they remind believers that evangelization relies less on human resources than on the Holy Spirit, the principal agent of evangelization. Healings are part of God's providential answer to the spiritual darkness of our times."

Nuestro mundo necesita saber que Dios está cerca. La curación y la liberación dejan que la luz de Jesucristo brille en la oscuridad de nuestros tiempos. Son signos del amor de nuestro Dios.


