

From Deacon Mike...

On June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed a law into effect that created Labor Day on the first Monday in September. The idea was to honor all those who labor, that is, all those who work for their daily bread. Labor has been with us since The Fall of Man. We read in Genesis, "Cursed is the ground because of you! In toil you shall eat its yield all the days of your life" (Genesis 3:17).

It is tempting to see work as a punishment. And sometimes it really feels like it. Like the old song says by Tennessee Ernie Ford says, "You load 16 tons and what do you get? Another day older and deeper in debt." It is true that work is a chore and that sometimes it feels like we are being punished for something. But Catholic teaching tells us that work is really good for us. It gives us purpose, it gives us dignity.

In Laborem Exercens, Pope St. John Paul II says, "Work is a good thing for man - a good thing for his humanity - because through work man not only transforms nature, adopting to his own needs, but he also achieves fulfillment as a human being and indeed in a sense, becomes 'more a human being." Work helps us to become more human.

Sometimes though, workers are exploited through unsafe or unhealthy work conditions, all for a profit. These conditions are unacceptable. The other half to the chorus of the Tennessee Ernie Ford song says, "St. Peter, don't call me 'cause I can't go, I owe my soul to the company store."

One of the Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching is the Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers. It states, "If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected - the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative." The economy must serve the people, not the other way around.

Pope Benedict XVI said in Caritas in Veritate, "in many cases, poverty results from a violation of the dignity of human work, either because work opportunities are limited (through unemployment or underemployment), or because low value is put on work and the rights that flow from it, especially the right to a just wage and to the personal security of the worker and his or her family."

So this weekend, as we celebrate with family and maybe some barbeque, let us remember all those who work in unsafe conditions and those that work in slave-like labor. Let us remember that work has a dignity that leads to the dignity of each worker.
