From Fr. Robert. . .

Halloween decorations have been out in the stores now for at least a month. As you consider what you put in your shopping cart, you would be wise to remember the light of our Catholic Faith. While dressing up and trick-ortreating can be fun, we Christians always have to be careful that we don't celebrate evil in any way. Those who love to celebrate darkness (witchcraft, Satanism, occult, etc.) consider Halloween to be their principal "feast day" of the year. And much of our culture is swept right along with a strange fascination with evil on this day. We, of course, are called to be "the light of the world" and can celebrate Halloween without making it dark.

The Bible warns us: "Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour" (1 Pt 5:8). We must remember that demons are real, and we don't want to open any doors to them in our lives.

Instead, this advice from St. Paul should guide us: "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Philippians 4:8).
