KNOW YOUR FAITH

MAXIMILIAN MARIA KOLBE (8 January 1894 – 14 August 1941) was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar, who volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the German death camp of Auschwitz, located in German-occupied Poland during World War II. He was active in promoting the veneration of the Immaculate Virgin Mary, founding and supervising the monastery of Niepokalanów near Warsaw, operating a radio station, and founding or running several other organizations and publications.

Kolbe was canonized on 10 October 1982 by Pope John Paul II, and declared a Martyr of charity. He is the patron saint of drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalists, prisoners, and the pro-life movement. Pope Saint John Paul II declared him "The Patron Saint of Our Difficult Century." Due to Kolbe's efforts to promote consecration and entrustment to Mary, he is also known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary.

THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY INTO HEAVEN, also known as the Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary (the Dormition), is the bodily taking up of the Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life.



The Catholic Church teaches as dogma that the Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." This doctrine was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on 1 November 1950, in the apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* in an exercise of papal infallibility. While the Eastern Orthodox Church believes in the Dormition of the Theotokos, which is the same as the Assumption, whether Mary had a physical death has not been dogmatically defined by the Roman Catholic Church.

In *Munificentissimus Deus* (item 39) Pope Pius XII pointed to the Book of

Genesis (3:15) as scriptural support for the dogma in terms of Mary's victory over sin and death as also reflected in 1 Corinthians 15:54: "then shall come to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory." Although the Assumption was only relatively recently defined as infallible dogma by the Catholic Church, apocryphal accounts of the assumption of Mary into heaven have circulated since at least the 4th century. The Catholic Church itself interprets chapter 12 of the Book of Revelation as referring to it. The earliest known narrative, dating to as early as the 3rd century, is the *Liber Requiei Mariae* (The Book of Mary's Repose), which survives intact only in an Ethiopian translation.
