

Know Your Faith

KATERI TEKEKWITHA [1656 – April 17, 1680] named by her people Tekakwitha ("She who bumps into things") and baptized as Catherine, was an Algonquin–Mohawk laywoman. Born near present-day Auriesville, New York, she contracted smallpox in an epidemic; her family died and her face was scarred. She converted to Roman Catholicism at age nineteen, when she was renamed Kateri in honor of St. Catherine of Siena. Refusing to marry, she left her village and moved for the remaining 5 years of her life to the Jesuit mission village south of Montreal.

Tekakwitha took a devout vow of perpetual virginity. Upon her death at the age of 24, witnesses said that minutes later her scars vanished and her face appeared radiant and beautiful. Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, she is the first Native American to be canonized.

Introductory Session: \$50.00 (non-refundable) User manual, chart, and stamps for the first 6 months: \$40.00

Private follow-ups: \$60.00 per follow-up Each follow-up is about 1½ hours, and 8 follow-ups are scheduled throughout the first year of charting. Follow-ups are the essential part in learning and gaining confidence with using the system. More information on follow-ups will be presented at the Introductory Session. Flexible payment options and insurance reimbursement forms may be provided based on your needs. 
