CORPORAL WORK OF MERCY FOR AUGUST: SCHOOL SUPPLIES

We will be collecting school supplies throughout August and September for San Miguel Catholic School. San Miguel School uniquely serves low-income youth in the DC area with a preference for those living in poverty and who would not otherwise have access to a high quality private Catholic education. This year San Miguel is particularly requesting items that will help with their athletic program and science and tech classes. These items are: outdoor basketballs (price per unit: \$16.99), kick balls (\$6.39), dodge balls (\$19.99/ six pack), AA batteries (\$18.98/ 48 in a pack—only 1 pack needed), AAA batteries (\$9.49 a pack—36 in a pack/ only 1 pack needed), envelope moisteners (\$14.29 a pack—4 in a pack/ only 1 pack needed), first aid supplies (\$19.99 a pack—four in a pack/ 2 packs needed), hot plates (\$17—five needed), and address labels (\$57.99—only one needed). KNOW YOUR FAITH

EDITH STEIN (in religion Teresa Benedicta of the Cross; 12 October 1891 – 9 August 1942) was a German Jewish philosopher who converted to Roman Catholicism. Born into an observant Jewish family, Stein was an atheist by her teenage years. After completing her doctoral thesis from the University of Göttingen in 1916, she taught at the University of Freiburg.

While reading the works of the reformer of the Carmelite Order, Teresa of Ávila, she was drawn to the Catholic faith. She was baptized on 1 January 1922 into the Roman Catholic Church. She wanted then to become a Discalced Carmelite nun, but was dissuaded by her spiritual mentors, so she taught at a Catholic school of education in Speyer. As a result of the requirement of an "Aryan certificate" for civil servants imposed by the Nazi government in 1933, she had to quit her teaching position.

She was admitted to the Discalced Carmelite monastery in Cologne the following October, taking the religious name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. In 1938, she and her sister Rosa (by then also a convert and an extern sister) were sent to the Carmelite monastery in the Netherlands for their safety. Despite the Nazi invasion of that state in 1940, they remained undisturbed until they were arrested by the Nazis on 2 August 1942 and sent to the Auschwitz concentration camp, where they died in the gas chamber on 9 August 1942.

POPE SIXTUS II (died 6 August 258) was the Pope from 31 August 257 until his death on 6 August 258. In the persecutions under Valerian in 258, numerous bishops, priests, and deacons were put to death. Pope Sixtus II was one of the first victims of this persecution, being beheaded on 6 August. He was martyred along with six deacons—Januarius, Vincentius, Magnus, Stephanus, Felicissimus and Agapitus. Lawrence of Rome, his best-known deacon, suffered martyrdom on 10 August, four days after his bishop.
