
We are a parish of the

KNOW YOUR FAITH

The ANIMA CHRISTI (Latin for 'Soul of Christ') is a prayer to Jesus of medieval origin. It is often prayed by Catholics as a post-communion devotion.

The sequence of sentences in the *Anima Christi* have rich associations with Catholic concepts that relate to the Eucharist (Body and Blood of Christ), Baptism (water) and the Passion of Jesus (Holy Wounds).

Its authorship remains uncertain. For many years, the *Anima Christi* was popularly believed to have been composed by St. Ignatius of Loyola, as he puts it at the beginning of his *Spiritual Exercises* and often refers to it. However, it has been found in a number of prayer books printed during Ignatius' youth and is in manuscripts which were written a hundred years before his birth.

In the early nineteenth century the prayer was translated and published as the English hymn "Soul of my Saviour, Sanctify my breast" by Edward Caswall; since then it has been popular as a communion hymn in Catholic communities.


