Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour

Please join us this Sunday for our Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour. Our priests will hear Confessions on Sunday from 2:00 PM - 3:00 PM. At 3:00 PM the Holy Hour will begin, where we will pray together the Divine Mercy Chaplet, before concluding with Solemn Vespers.

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, it is known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her Diary entry 699. In all, St. Faustina recorded 14 revelations from Jesus about His desire for this feast

Extraordinary Graces Received on Divine Mercy Sunday

Amongst the 14 revelations recorded by St. Faustina are three promises that our Lord makes of specific extraordinary graces to be received on Divine Mercy Sunday:

- · I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109).
- · Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (300).
- · The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (699).

To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday, or at the Vigil celebration, by making a good Confession beforehand, as well as staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy.

The worthy reception of the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday is sufficient to obtain the extraordinary graces promised by Jesus. A plenary indulgence, obtained by fulfilling the usual conditions, is also available.

"A plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions (Confession, Communion, prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honour of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus."
