## Reflecting On the Sacred Heart

Among the images seen on the ceiling is the Sacred Heart of Jesus, located just above the sanctuary. The Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Most Chaste Heart of Joseph appear in union with it, each over their respective side altars.

Whether viewed as an image or addressed in prayer, the idea of the Sacred Heart is deeply ingrained in the Catholic consciousness. At the same time, many people don't fully understand it, although it represents, literally, the core of our faith.

Hearts take on an importance in many cultures. They're considered sources of life and courage, as well as the emotions (science points to strong connections between them). Our Lord's heart was pierced during the Crucifixion, and saints have venerated it as a symbol of His love and sacrifice from a very early period.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart gained particular momentum in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century, after Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French nun. During one vision, He revealed His Heart, "more dazzling than the sun and transparent as crystal." The Cross stood above it, and a crown of thorns encircled it.

Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret at a time when many Catholics were being influenced by the heresy of Jansenism, which emphasized a wrathful God. Jesus instead wanted to show His heart burning out of love for mankind, and desiring our love in return.

St. Margaret later wrote: "Consider often that it is only the humble of heart that can enter into the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ, converse with Him, love Him, and be loved by Him." It's interesting that she speaks of the heart as a physical reality, a place one *enters into*.

We get an echo of this in the sanctuary, which is predominantly red. The entire space is like the interior of the Sacred Heart, where the priest celebrates the Mass, and we come to receive Communion at the altar rail. We enter into Him, and He enters into us.

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart, and it's a good opportunity to spend time in Eucharistic Adoration, reflecting on how differently our faith views things of the flesh. The great scandal of the Incarnation is that our human nature now resides in Heaven. The Sacred Heart beats there, just as it did once in the womb of the Blessed Virgin.
