Introit: O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to You; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Saviour! The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?

The Altar to St. Joseph

If the Annunciation mural over the altar to Mary suggests the promises of Heaven, the mural over the Joseph altar speaks about exile. We've come very quickly from a flourishing garden to a barren desert.

There's no real life in this landscape, just sand and stone. Egypt was the place of slavery for the people of Israel, filled with false gods, and now the Holy Family journeys through it, looking for refuge.

At no other moment in his life is Joseph's role as loving father and protector more in evidence. He leads the donkey on which Mary and the Child Jesus ride; his grip both literally and symbolically holds the family together. His faith in God's providence will guide them until it's safe to return home.

Having recently come off the Year of St. Joseph, much attention has been paid to why we revere this great saint. He is, of course, the patron of fathers and workers. We pray to him for a holy death. But he's also the Terror of Demons, and it's worth noting that this title finds its origins in the scene portrayed in the mural.

Exile is never easy, whether we're in a foreign land or just struggling to find one's place in life. Even family life can feel at times like exile, with its moments of joy and consolation mixed with pain and difficulty. At these moments, we're most vulnerable to attack from dark forces.

St. Faustina wrote that it was St. Joseph himself who urged her to turn to him for protection, especially when we start to despair. God endowed Joseph with the grace to trust completely and not give in to fear. We see that trust and union with God in the image of the Most Chaste Heart of Joseph, which flames with the same divine love as the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Joseph's altar, like Mary's, expands out from the sanctuary. His initials, set against the same soft green of the Holy Spirit, intertwine with the initials of Christ. Above this, we see the ripening grape vines and fleur-de-lis, but in this case the latter is surmounted by a carpenter's square.

His statue holds a flowering staff. Just as Aaron's staff sprouted blossoms as a sign that he was chosen by God to lead the Israelites out of Egypt, Joseph's suggests his role as guide and protector for the Holy Family, as well as for those who turn to him in prayer.

The altar to Joseph speaks about exile, but it also shows, through his example, how to find our way through.
