Introit: The Lord is the strength of His people, a saving refuge for the one He has anointed. Save Your people, Lord, and bless Your herniate, and govern them for ever. Unto You, O Lord, will I cry; O my God, be not silent with me; if You remain silent, I will become like those who go down into the grave.

Gradual: Turn back, O Lord, ever so slightly, we beseech You, and consent to be entreated by Your servants. O Lord, You have been unto us a refuge, from age to age.

Alleluia: In You Lord, do I trust, let me never be put to shame; in Your righteousness deliver me and rescue me; lend me Your ear and make haste to save me.

Offertory: Render secure my footsteps in Your paths so that my feet do not slip; incline Your ear & hear my words; display Your wonderful mercies O Lord, Saviour of those who place their hope in You.

Communion: I shall walk around about His sanctuary, offering a sacrifice of jubilation; I will sing and recite a psalm to the Lord.

"Cantare amantis est"

If you stand near the altar and face back towards the choir, you'll see the images of two lyres on the church ceiling. Considering the importance of music to the Church, this ancient symbol of praise seems appropriate, yet it also holds a message for those who come to Mass.

We hear two types of music in church: sacred (liturgical) music and religious hymns. The former are based on Scripture, and part of the Mass itself, while the latter center around religious themes and are typically heard outside of it (during the Recessional, for example).

Gregorian chant is most often used for the varying texts of the proper, but we may also hear polyphonic music sung by the choir. When the ordinary texts are sung – the Kyrie, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei – the congregation joins in, as they do for responses and hymns.

Listening to a good choir – or a professional cantor, as is sometimes the case at other parishes – may tempt one to assume that singing along isn't necessary. Yet singing on the part of the congregation has mattered since the earliest days of the Church, for the Mass is a dialogue between Christ (who stands in the person of the priest) and His faithful, and this requires an elevated form of language.

St. Augustine famously wrote that "he who sings, prays well." His belief was that music affected the soul, and could therefore influence the actions and morals of people. Yet he took the role of music even further when he stated, "Cantare amantis est" – singing is a lover's thing. When we have something important to say, words alone are rarely enough. We *need* music.

We communicate with our whole person – our whole body – when we sing. Music is the language of the heart, and to sing in church is to communicate from the heart. Doing so follows the example of the choirs of angels, who, in announcing the birth of Christ, filled the air with joyful praise.

When we sing out of love, the quality of one's voice isn't the most important thing. Sacred music – based on Divine Revelation and formed in beauty – lifts our heart, mind, and soul to God. It's the highest expression of prayer, bridging the visible and invisible realms.

So, if your natural inclination is to hold back while others sing – don't. In the words of the Letter to the Ephesians, "be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts."

Renew My Church Update: May 2023

<u>Discernment Process:</u> During the past few months, St. Joseph (Round Lake) and St. Peter (Volo) Parishes engaged in the Renew My Church (RMC) review and discernment process. The Grouping Feedback and Discernment team (GFDT), which was made up of members from each community, met to review and discern how to respond to the call to renewal for the grouping's parishes, including any potential changes to parish structures.

Based on their meetings and feedback gathered from the larger parish community, they submitted feedback to the archdiocese. The Archdiocesan Standards and Recommendations Commission, which includes representatives from across the Archdiocese of Chicago, reviewed the feedback and other information, including financial summaries and parish trends.

Cardinal Cupich and Bishop Grob are grateful to the parish leaders who gathered as a Grouping Team, as well as all the parishioners who offered feedback through the discernment process.

<u>Outcome</u>: In the past few weeks, Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, archbishop of Chicago, the archdiocese's auxiliary bishops, and the archdiocese's Presbyteral Council met to discuss the Commission's recommendation. Based upon those discussions and prayerful consideration, Cardinal Cupich made the following decisions regarding the Round Lake/Volo grouping.

- Both parishes will remain in their current structure.
 - Cardinal Cupich affirmed the feedback that formally uniting the parishes would not be fruitful for the sake of renewal.
 - The RMC Commission was excited to learn about the work of renewal already begun in each parish and the commitment of each parish to continue on the path of renewal with an even deeper focus.
 - Cardinal Cupich affirms the grouping team's vision that continued work, especially in the area of evangelization and re-evangelization of parishioners, will be necessary to reground people in their discipleship. We know that only disciples can invite and inspire other disciples.
 - Pope Francis calls us to not only be disciples of Jesus, but Missionary Disciples who share the Good News of Jesus in the world around us, a world yearning to hear and know Jesus.
 - The Renew My Church imperative of making disciples will continue to be the mission into the decades to come.

Next Steps: The parish communities will continue to the next phase of renewal, focusing on strong evangelization to the world around us. Specifically, with the support of the Parish Vitality Coordinator, Eleanor Segraves, and the Evangelization team of the Archdiocese, your parishes will continue to build the new reality, focused on deepening discipleship, and supporting disciples in becoming missionary disciples for the work of evangelization. The renewal process calls us to become a stronger, more sustainable presence for the future, capable of reaching more people by sharing our discipleship in Jesus Christ, building communities with one another and inspiring witness in the world around us.
