An Ordinary Man Made Extraordinary

“God loves us beyond comprehension, and we cannot diminish God’s love for us,” wrote St. Peter, and perhaps no one understood that reality better than this most human of saints.

The New Testament tells us more about Peter than almost any other figure, aside from Christ himself – not only details of his life, but also hints of his character and habits. Peter comes to us in flashes, through moments of action and dialogue, and by the time we get to his writings, we feel we know him well.

The west transept window of the church, which shows Peter being freed from prison by an angel, also tells his story in flashes, through symbols painted around the window’s border. Each symbol provides a point of meditation on how God worked in Peter’s life.

They appear in no particular chronology. There’s a severed ear and sword, representing the moment Peter attacked the priests’ servant, Malchus. The shackle and chain that bound Peter in prison. The rooster that crowed after he denied Jesus. At the top, the symbolic keys, given to him by Christ.

On the other side, there’s the basin and ewer Christ used to wash Peter’s feet (against his protests). The fishing boat representing Peter’s trade. The upside-down crucifix used for his horrific martyrdom. And, finally, at the bottom, is the Chair of Peter, symbolizing his role as the first pope.

On one level, we’re reminded of how ordinary Peter was. He left a simple life behind to follow Jesus, and didn’t always find the new way easy. His trust and understanding could waver. His impulsive nature caused problems (especially during that moment in the garden) and, following Christ’s arrest, Peter gave in to fear and denied even knowing Him. In the lowest moment of his life, he was tortured by a sense of failure.

Yet Christ knew from the beginning what Peter would become. Peter’s innate humility had allowed him to recognize Christ as the Messiah before anyone else did, and his ability to ask for forgiveness provided the foundation for his leadership of the Church.

After the Ascension, Peter was arrested and marked for death as one of Christ’s followers. His release by the angel on the night before his trial in some ways echoed Christ’s Resurrection, and brought Peter to a new understanding.

He recognized – and spent the rest of his time on earth teaching– that God alone has the power to remove all the chains that bind us in life. And He does this despite our failings and weakness, and even our betrayals of Him. Small wonder that Peter – an ordinary man made extraordinary through God’s grace – should marvel at greatness of His love.
