Introit: When I cried out to the Lord, He heeded my call against my assailants; He who is before the beginning of the world and who endures forever has humbled them. Cast your cares upon the Lord, and He will sustain you. Hear my prayer, O God, and despise not my supplication; be attentive to me and hear me.

The Saints Windows

One goal of the church restoration has been to incorporate the colors and stylistic elements of the existing stained glass windows into the new paint scheme. The windows along the aisles date from 1941 and highlight saints who were patrons of the parishioners being memorialized.

Starting on the west wall and moving clockwise, the first window shows **St. Matthew** in his job as tax collector, with geometric rays representing the moment God's grace enters his heart.

Next, we have **St. Leo the Great**, the 5th Century Pope who protected the Church from heresy, and led Rome against an invasion by Attila the Hun in 452. Legend has it that when Leo marched out, a "great man" appeared in the sky behind him. Here, the artist has rendered that figure as St. Michael.

St. Henry, the Holy Roman Emperor who died in 1024, appears in the next window. Both St. Henry and his wife, St. Kunigunde, were known for their extraordinary piety and charity, as well as for placing their kingdom under the patronage of the See of St. Peter.

The last window on the west wall depicts **St. Anthony of the Desert**. Despite his common appellation, the saint is shown here in a lush, heavenly setting, in his role as patron of domestic animals.

Directly across the church on the east wall, the first window uses "Jacob" as an alternative name for **St. James the Lesser**, Bishop of Jerusalem. It portrays his martyrdom at the hands of the Pharisees, who hurled him from the roof of the temple to a mob below.

The next window shows **St. Nicholas** as bishop, with his basket of food and gifts for the poor. Following this, we again have **St. Peter**, this time in the famous moment when Our Lord lifted him up from the waves.

Finally, one of the most dramatic windows depicts **St. George** slaying the dragon. Despite his link to chivalric legend, St. George was actually a Roman soldier and convert martyred under Diocletian. His valor and selflessness makes him a natural symbol in the universal fight against evil.

In 2002, Daprato Rigali Studios created and installed the window of **Our Lady of Guadalupe** on the back wall of the church. For the restoration, care was taken to blend its softer tones with the new paint scheme in the area of the choir loft.

While decorative elements enhance the beauty of the windows of St. Peter's, they're also meant to draw the observer more deeply into contemplation of them. In this way, the windows accomplish their intended purpose: to lift up the hearts of the faithful through the artistic marriage of color and light.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA, is the process by which we receive adults into full communion with the Church. This period of formation is an important time for new and returning Catholics to learn and grow in their faith while preparing to receive the Sacraments.
