Instaurare Omnia in Christo - To Restore All Things in Christ

Although more than 900 people attend Mass every Sunday, St. Peter's is considered a mid-sized parish. Its growth over the last decade sometimes makes the church seem small, yet it was quite large when first built in 1926, serving only 44 families.

To build a church on that scale not long after a world war was a sign of hope for the future, even though the interior had relatively few decorations. More additions, including the present stained glass windows, were installed during WWII. It's almost as if the church flourished in reaction to events in the outside world.

People need to have hope in their lives, especially when things seem to be falling apart. The church provides a place to find it. Its physical structure, therefore, has to be more than utilitarian; it should reflect a profound sense of mystery. What we experience inside needs to match the reality of what happens there.

During the Credo, we profess our belief in all things visible and invisible. We understand that the sacrifice of the Mass is never just a reenactment of a past event, but the moment when Christ appears to us in His body, blood, soul, and divinity. The church has historically used art to recreate this coexistence of the material and divine realms. The current restoration borrows from that tradition to respond to the growing need for God.

With all its color and symbolism, the new interior of St. Peter's is meant to inspire a sense of awe, as well as a way to know God better. Such art is a language that even a young child can understand, because it's beautiful and speaks to the multifold nature of His love for us.

Over the coming weeks, final restoration projects will continue in the church, including the installation of a new floor. Instead of carpeting, the aisles will soon have decorative travertine tile, with darker tile underneath the pews. Work is expected to start on the baptistry as well, pending final approval of the design.

Most of the remaining work will be on a smaller scale, with other repairs and additions done on an as-needed basis. The doors into the nave will be refinished with wood to match the wainscoting. Electricians are making final touches to the lighting in the sanctuary. Once the statues have been retouched, they'll go in their new places on the walls.

As always, we remain grateful for the support of everyone who made the restoration possible, from the team headed by Slawek Miskow, to parishioners who supported the project financially and spiritually.

Canons Regular on Pilgrimage: July 31st - August 8th

Each year, the priests and brothers of the Canons Regular observe an annual retreat. This year members will travel to Kraków from July 31st to August 8th, where they will visit the tomb of St. John Cantius in thanksgiving for 25 years as a religious community.

While the Canons are away, the Norbertines from St. Michael's Abbey in California will tend to the weekday and Sunday Masses, as well as other sacramental needs.
