### The St. Henry Window

The third window on the west wall features the Holy Roman Emperor Henry II, also known as St. Henry the Exuberant, who ruled until 1024 and was canonized by Pope Eugene III in 1146. While very familiar to the German community that made up St. Peter parish in the 1940s, this saint is seldom recognized today. That's a shame, considering how relevant he is to our current age.

The image shows St. Henry overseeing plans for the Bamberg Cathedral, where he and his empress, St. Cunegunde, are now buried. He intended the diocese to be the new Rome in Germany, with a spiritual influence extending throughout Europe. It's said that both Henry and Cunegunde were so devoted to God that they agreed to a celibate marriage. If so, that would be a radical act for a royal couple – but Henry always was a different kind of ruler.

Devout from a young age, he took seriously the idea that temporal kings received their authority through Christ alone. What for most is little more than a formulaic coronation oath, Henry accepted as his guiding principle, divesting himself of nearly all personal ambition. Instead he spent his life strengthening the Church and spreading the Catholic faith.

This was no small feat in a world that still held to remnants of the Viking era. Henry fought hard to bring the warring factions of his empire together under the auspices of the Holy See. He built monasteries and drove monastic reform with the help of his mentor, the Abbot of Cluny (later St. Odilo). At the same time, he spent most of his family's wealth helping the poor. Yet even while surrounded by ambitious nobles and disgruntled relatives, he kept a firm hand on uprisings, pardoning those who rebelled and maintaining peace within his kingdom.

Aside from Cunegunde, Henry found his strength through prayer. He was particularly fond of singing the Divine Office, and once, after joining the canons at Strasburg Cathedral, he expressed a fervent desire to "remain always there to sing the divine praises." He founded a new canonry for one individual, whose job would be to perform that duty in the king's name.

One might say that Henry's reign enabled the flourishing of the Sacred, with all its impact on Western culture, that Catholics today are trying hard to restore. In that sense it's very fitting to have him depicted, along with Cunegunde in the background, on one of our church windows.

Finally, it's worth noting that St. Henry offers a model for leaders today – as unlikely as that seems in the current political climate. Yet the world he navigated was as treacherous and dark as our own. Lacking support from most of those around him, he turned to the only precedent that mattered: Christ Himself, who never let him fail.
