Alleluia - Christ has risen and He has shone upon us whom He has ransomed with His own blood.


Alleluia - I have chosen you from the world, in order that you might go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should last.

The Great Prayer of the Church

The Divine Office, or Liturgy of the Hours, often seems to exist in its own universe. For many faithful, it suggests monastic life, or at least something outside of ordinary prayer. Its roots in Jewish practice and the earliest years of the Christian Church suggest that it was always meant to include the laity, yet it remains mysterious for most Catholics. And there are reasons why some people avoid it.

Traditionally, the hours were (and sometimes still are) prayed seven times a day, with an additional hour at night. This structure, established by St. Benedict around 530 A.D., was simplified in the 16th Century, and again in the 20th Century under Pope Pius X and Pope Pius XII. After Vatican II, Pope Paul VI made yet another revision to the hours, with an eye towards greater accessibility and participation among lay Catholics. Nevertheless, the length of the Divine Office can vary, depending on where it's said. And for Catholics hoping to learn more, there are several confusing variations on the breviary – although phone apps make it easier to get started.

Why pray it, then, when we have comprehensive devotions like the Rosary? Because the Divine Office isn't actually a devotion but an essential part of the liturgy – what St. Benedict called the *Opus Dei*, the Work of God. Countless saints, including St. Thomas Aquinas, have considered the Divine Office the most important prayer in the Church. "The praise of God is more meritorious than the works of mercy," Aquinas wrote, underscoring how such prayer helps sanctify and heal the entire world.

This is why priests aren't required to say the Mass every day, but must recite the Divine Office (as do all religious). The Mass may be the heart of the Church's liturgy, but the Divine Office is its lifeblood, flowing into and out from the Holy Sacrifice. Although offered for everyone, it has a way of nurturing the individual; in the words of St. Teresa of Avila, it "feeds the soul with the language of the Church."

The language is drawn primarily from the Psalms, with Gospel readings, antiphons, canticles, hymns and other spiritual writings woven in. Together these form a meditative dialogue with God that's especially powerful when chanted by a group, but the prayers can be recited alone. In the Divine Office, we speak to Him in the same words Christ used, which gives us strength and focus to continue His work in the world. At the same time, we participate with Catholics everywhere in a universal hymn of praise.

Over the next few weeks, we'll be exploring the hours and prayers of the Divine Office in more depth. We also warmly welcome everyone to join the Canons daily for their prayers in the church (hours are posted in the bulletin and on the website).
