The Prayers of the Divine Office

At first glance, the Divine Office might seem repetitious, an endless series of rote prayers. In reality its narrative – built on Psalms, readings, sermons, and antiphons – changes hour by hour, day by day, week by week, depending on the liturgical season. One thing, however, remains constant: the presence of Christ, Whose story this is.

The hinge hours of Lauds and Vespers always include two songs in praise of God: the *Benedictus*, or Canticle of Zecheriah, and the *Magnificat* of Mary. These were made part of the daily rhythm of monastic prayer by St. Benedict, who considered them essential Gospel proclamations, even templates of Christian belief.

The *Benedictus* is a prophetic hymn, linking the coming of Christ to God's covenant with Israel. "The dawn from on high will visit us," Zecheriah says, "to shine on those who sit in darkness and death's shadow." We're hearing not only of Christ's birth but also His Resurrection – He's like the sun that offers new hope, no matter how dark the night. The *Magnificat* picks up the theme again at Vespers: the ancient promises are fulfilled, and God has reentered human history to reverse worldly power and redeem mankind.

The daily recitation of these canticles seeks to remind us that Christ is the True Way. There's always a temptation among people to believe that God hasn't responded to their needs, or that there's a better or more esoteric way to know Him. These declarations of His mercy, originally spoken by the humblest of disciples, tell us otherwise.

The Psalms, which are the central prayers of the Office, also sound different in relation to the canticles. They're the voice of the individual soul, but now take on added dimensions.

One can experience an entire range of human emotion in a single day: joy, sorrow, fear, longing, delight, grief, hope, anger. The Psalms encompass all of these private feelings. Take time during the day to pray the Divine Office, and one is often struck by how the Psalms seem to speak to the current moment — if not for oneself directly, than for the world. They're universal prayers, speaking for untold generations of people, into the present day.

They were also the prayers known by Christ, and continue to speak of Him, and through Him. They've become the voice of the Church's Mystical Body – what St. Augustine called "One Christ, loving Himself." This, in essence, is what the Divine Office is.

Priests and religious are required to pray it, but what is the benefit for the laity? Next week, we'll show how this beautiful liturgy sanctifies the hours of our earthly lives, and encourages us to dedicate the work of our hands, minds, and hearts to God's divine plan. We'll also offer a few suggestions for getting started.
