#### **Celebrating Corpus Christi**

By the 13<sup>th</sup> Century, belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist was universally accepted, but no specific feast celebrating it existed outside of Holy Thursday, which is overshadowed by the Passion.

Change came when a Norbertine canoness, St. Juliana of Liège, had a vision of Christ requesting a feast dedicated solely to the Holy Eucharist. One of her champions was Bishop Robert of Liège, who instituted such a feast in his own diocese in 1246. Wider adoption came after the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena (1263), in which a consecrated Host bled during Mass.

A year later, Pope Uban IV made the feast of **Corpus Christi** universal for the Latin Church. He commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Mass and Office, including hymns such as *Pange lingua*, *Tantum ergo*, and *Adoro te devote*.

Corpus Christi is a day for joy. Join us today for our annual Corpus Christi Procession, which begins at 2:15 PM with Solemn Vespers. The procession follows immediately afterwards in the church.

#### **Living the Divine Office**

In the 12<sup>th</sup> Century, a Cistercian abbot named Guerric of Igny gave a sermon comparing the Divine Office to the workings of a beehive. The chanting monks, he said, were like bees working harmoniously together, gathering nectar and transforming it into honey. The structured rhythm of psalmody and prayer rendered sweet praise to God, while providing spiritual nourishment.

Few metaphors better describe the individual and universal graces offered by the Divine Office. We wake in the morning and start our day: laboring, raising young, solving problems, preparing food. Life on earth is a continuum that constantly renews, but when we integrate prayer into this routine, everyday tasks take on deeper significance.

On one level, the Divine Office compels us to pay closer attention to what we do. "We are the bees of the invisible," the poet Rilke once wrote. "With total absorption, we gather the nectar of the visible into the great golden honeycomb of the invisible." He could have been describing this particular quality of attention, which maintains a constant awareness of the divine. It affects our moral consciousness, and makes us want to live according to God's plan.

As the great prayer of the Church, the Divine Office is something we offer for all creation. Our smallest efforts matter. That's why the laity are encouraged to pray it – if not over the whole day (which might be difficult for some), then by entering in at any point. One can pray Lauds in the morning, and Vespers at night, or maybe take a break at Terce or None, or find some moment to do the Office of Readings. Compline is a beautiful prayer at bedtime. For those who are elderly or housebound, reading the entire Divine Office can fill inactive hours with tremendous purpose. For a busier person, like a student, the Office is a moment to break away and spend quiet time with God.

How does one start? At this time, investing in the four-volume Divine Office isn't actually recommended, due to significant changes and additions to its liturgy scheduled to take place by 2027. Instead, one might try the shorter *Catholic Prayer* from Catholic Book Publishing, which contains the morning, evening, and night prayers, along with an abbreviated section for the Office of Readings and daytime prayers.

Alternatively, there are several excellent digital options, which make the Office very easy to learn (and portable). These include free versions such as **iBreviary**, available through both a website and app, as well as **Universalis**, available for a small, one-time fee. There are also a growing number of websites dedicated to helping people make the Divine Office a part of their lives.

Finally, we encourage parishioners to join the Canons whenever possible as they pray the Office in the church. Please see the schedule in the bulletin.

#### Gregorian Chant 101: A Three-Part Workshop For the Laity Tuesdays @ 7:00 PM, July 8th - 22nd

Come discover the timeless beauty and prayerful power of Gregorian chant in this introductory workshop for all parishioners, taught by Fr. Nathan Caswell, SJC. Over the course of three Tuesday evenings, we'll explore the tradition of chant and learn to sing the Ordinary parts of the Mass — those sung by the people each Sunday — including the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, Agnus Dei, and Credo. Using our new parish hymnal, we'll cover the basics of chant notation and ecclesiastical Latin pronunciation. No prior musical training is necessary — just a willingness to lift your voice in prayer.
