The Reality of Freedom

The Book of Exodus tells us how the Hebrews, finally freed from slavery in Egypt, lost their trust and faith in God on the way home and instead worshipped a golden calf. The story has a familiar resonance, for idolatry is an ancient and deeply human flaw, rooted in Original Sin.

Our culture today is filled with false idols, like money and power, and the elusive concept of freedom. Americans think of the latter as a right and a necessity, but we often have trouble describing what it means. For some, freedom means physical autonomy, or a lack of social boundaries. For others, it means having choices. Many believe that freedom means being able to pursue meaning outside of religion.

God, in fact, is often seen as the greatest barrier to freedom. He's the ultimate killjoy, Whose commandments seem more about restriction than liberation. Yet, paradoxically, people who seek freedom apart from God become increasingly less free. We see this in those who are burdened by the consequences of addiction and vice, or paralyzed by hopelessness, because they have no longer have any clear sense of what's good and true. In such an environment, other forces can take over.

Totalitarian governments are notable for their absence of God. It's no coincidence that faith – especially in the person of Christ – is among the first things suppressed in the wake of social revolution. Those who would remake society know that Christ told us we're made for God alone, an idea they find intolerable.

Christ embodied the reality that our true freedom is rooted in *Imago Dei*, being created in God's image. Among the gifts God shares with us as image-bearers is free will — the ability to choose, to reason, to love. We act in freedom, because without this ability, love itself would be impossible. God gave us freedom knowing we'd abuse it, just as our first parents did, but this is how He loves us, and how He wishes us to love others.

Even when Mankind was broken and unrepentant, God showed us love by sending His Son. Christ entered into our freedom, becoming like us and willingly taking on the consequences of our sin. His sacrifice showed how we might be restored to God's likeness, by following Him in all things.

"Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom," St. Paul says in his letter to the Corinthians. By living for God, and turning our lives to His purpose, we're no longer constrained by the false idols of the world, but drawn into His boundless life of grace, where true freedom begins.
