Vocation Spotlight: Jack Farrell



Jack Farrell (above far left) found his way to religious life after studying philosophy in college. There – like many students – he’d drifted away from his faith. Things really began to change after he came to St. Peter’s and encountered the Latin Mass.

“I believe God has worked miracles in my life through this parish,” Jack says. During Advent last year, a retreat with the Institute of Christ the King (ICKSP) made him realize he wanted to pursue a vocation.

“I knew that Our Lady wanted me to be here,” he says. Now in a year of formation with the IKCSP in Detroit, Jack serves as the community’s sacristan and attends classes, learning Latin and French. He hopes to be sent to their seminary near Florence, Italy to continue his studies, and asks parishioners at St. Peter’s to keep him in their prayers.

Starting Over in Faith

When we're young, we usually have an idea of how we hope life will turn out. We plan for a certain career, or a family. We think of the years as a straight trajectory that always takes us forward. Of course, we eventually learn that it never works out that way.

Some of us manage to live our dreams (at least in part), but others flounder, or get blindsided by circumstance, or take unexpected detours. Many people climb high, only to fall hard. Others feel they never did anything, for nothing worked out as they planned. We all have regrets and emotional baggage as we get older, including the fear that we've done it all wrong.

The truth is, we don't control much in life, except our choices. These influence what happens, but we're really part of God's providential plan. In a way, "faith" can be understood as acknowledging this divine pattern of existence, and our role in it. When we make this connection, life takes on a completely different perspective.

Scripture constantly shows us God's pattern. The Old Testament prefigures Christ, and the New Testament speaks to both His life on earth and to the world to come. Christ, too, shows us a pattern in His Person, especially in regards to charity. His sacrifice suggests that our lives are not really about personal accomplishments, but the outpouring of ourselves, for the sake of others.

Catholicism, perhaps more than any other faith, underscores this idea that we're involved in something much bigger than we think. If we accept this as a gift, we can accomplish more in life than we ever imagined. God takes us in hand, even when we provide him with pathetic raw material.

Consider Kevin Matthews, who will speak here at St. Peter's on October 13th. Once a prominent radio personality, Matthews lost his job and his health, only to find his way to Christ through a broken statue of the Virgin Mary. His story has given hope to thousands of people, Catholic and non-Catholic alike, and is a unique example of how taking one's faith into the public square can have an unexpected impact.

Yet the real lesson may be that we're not supposed to have expectations for what happens in life. We offer God whatever talents and skills we possess, whether we're just starting out, or starting again, and trust in His love for us.

The words of St. John Henry Newman express it perfectly: "God has created me to do Him some definite service . . . I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. Therefore, I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I cannot be thrown away."
