

Vocation Spotlight: Br. Stephen of the Holy Face of Jesus

Aric Bukiri is a cradle Catholic who – like many young people today – found himself drawn back to the Church in the last several years. As a parishioner at St. Peter's, he became deeply affected by the Holy Face devotion and Carmelite spirituality, in particular by St. John of the Cross and St. Thérèse of Lisieux.

After a long period of discernment, Aric entered the Discalced Hermits of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Fairfield, PA, where he's now a Novitiate. The community follows the ancient Carmelite charism in its contemplative form: chanting each hour of the Divine Office, along with periods of mental prayer, study, and manual labor.

While far-removed from modern life, the monastery ideally suits Aric's temperament and love of the mystic tradition – showing once again how God finds a place for everyone He calls.

Admonishing the Sinner

It's been said that the only thing needed for evil to succeed in the world is for good people to say or do nothing. There's some truth in that, as history shows us. Silence in the face of wrongdoing — whether social injustice, moral corruption, or spiritual decay — has almost invariably bred more suffering, not only physical in nature, but spiritual.

This is one reason why the Church places such emphasis on the third Spiritual Work of Mercy: admonishing the sinner. Failing to speak or act against wrongdoing, especially when it's our responsibility to do so, is not only a failure of charity, but can be a sin of omission. The likelihood of this increases with our level of responsibility toward others – for example, of parents toward their children.

Despite this, most people can find performing this particular Act of Mercy challenging. To admonish puts one in opposition to another person, which can be tiresome – or deadly, as St. Thomas More learned when he stood against King Henry VIII. These days, it's hard to criticize any kind of bad behavior without being labeled judgmental, or even a hater. This is a strange inversion of the Christian precept “do not judge,” and it's used precisely to shut down debate. But we can't take that personally.

“Admonish” has various meanings, but it never means to berate or condemn. Rather, it's meant to point out a moral danger that a person might not be aware of, and call him to conversion. Fraternal corrections are like spiritual interventions, similar to what we might do for an alcoholic. It's insightful to read about how the saints have handled this important responsibility, and take some tips from them.

One of the most famous admonishments in history came from St. Catherine of Siena, when in 1376 she wrote to Pope Gregory XI, urging him to return the papacy from Avignon to Rome. “I beg you, in the name of Christ crucified, that you be not a timorous child but manly in your work,” she said. Catherine was always humble towards authority, but also bold and deeply loving. She never spoke harshly but with the fire of charity, which came through her faith and hope.

We need to forget our personal hurts and fears when admonishing others. When we approach sinners with humility, knowing that we ourselves aren't perfect, the right words come more easily. When we pray to God for guidance, we tend to find the right time to speak. After all, He wants us to do this work.

The salvation of souls should be our highest priority. As St. Augustine said: “He who loves another would rather have him angry with him for telling the truth, than lost by deceit.”

May Perpetual Light Shine Upon Them

November is dedicated to the Faithful Departed who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith and awaiting the glory of the Resurrection. A **plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory**, is granted to the faithful who, on any and each day from **November 1 to 8**, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

A **plenary indulgence for All Souls' Day** will also be granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on **November 2** and recite the Our Father and the Creed.
