When I Am Weak, Then I Am Strong

The Fourth Spiritual Work of Mercy – bearing wrongs patiently – doesn't always feel like a "work." On the surface, it appears passive, and contrary to what is right and just. We're not supposed to let others oppress us: therapists offer advice on how we should respond, and it rarely involves just taking it on the chin.

Everyone has had some experience of being wronged, whether it's in a bad marriage, a toxic workplace, at school, or in line at the coffee shop. These interactions can be intensely stressful, especially if they take place over the long-term. More often than not, we keep silent and let it blow over.

Yet "bearing wrongs patiently" suggests that this approach can be fruitful, if we make it an active practice. Many saints, including Francis of Assisi, actually looked for opportunities to do so; one even transformed it into a vocation, which eventually made her a Doctor of the Church.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux can have a sugary image, which is unfortunate – her autobiography reveals a passionate and perceptive individual, with extraordinary spiritual depth. These qualities didn't come to her easily, although she was strong-willed enough to convince Pope Leo XIII to let her enter the convent at only 15.

Once there, however, she struggled with her desire to do "great deeds" for God – how could she, when she had no obvious talents? To make things worse, Thérèse had trouble from other nuns, who criticized her work. Some believed that her piety was exaggerated. Others had annoying habits, that interrupted her prayers. Thérèse began to experience spiritual dryness – until she recognized that Christ had endured far worse, and turned it into love.

She chose never to acknowledge wrongs, except with humility and kindness. She prayed for her fellow nuns, especially the difficult ones, and tried to be helpful. Christ had set an example for her with His Passion, and while her own trials may have been relatively small, her response to them was not. Every interaction became an opportunity to practice charity.

Of course, this became the foundation of her "Little Way": doing small things, especially unpleasant ones, with unflinching love. It's unlikely that Thérèse ever imagined that her approach would become a spiritual movement that would sweep through the world, but it did when her autobiography was published. This is another example of how God takes up our lives for His own purposes: unexpectedly, paradoxically, and when we least expect it.

When we bear wrongs patiently, we put our complete trust in Him. This doesn't mean blindly accepting sin or suffering, but recognizing that He gives us these particular moments for a reason. Through grace, our trials become the anvil on which a great soul may be forged.



Holy Face Devotion

Thursday, November 13th, 7:00 PM

St. Therese of Lisieux was especially dedicated to this beautiful devotion, to the point that she took the name "Therese of the Child Jesus and of the Holy Face." Universally practiced before World War I, it fell into obscurity during the 20th Century but has since become an important element in the restoration of Catholic culture.

Our Lord Himself revealed the Holy Face Devotion in 1844 to a French Carmelite nun named Sr. Mary of St. Peter. He asked that it be spread throughout the world, with the goal of making reparation for sins which offend God. **Please join us for veneration of a Vatican-verified Holy Face relic, Eucharistic Adoration, Rosary, and prayers of reparation.**
