Forgive Those Who Trespass Against Us

The Fifth Spiritual Work of Mercy, forgiving others willingly, speaks to the very heart of Christian faith. When asked how often we should forgive people, Jesus replied, “not seven times, but seventy-seven,” which is another way of saying always. He repeated the theme of forgiveness in His parables and sermons, in the Lord’s Prayer, in His miracles, and in His dying words.

Nevertheless, forgiveness can be hard for many people, especially when hurt come from those we love. Some wrongs cause intense pain and confusion; at their worst, they can affect our sense of identity, and even our will to live. Our natural defense is anger, which we often keep bottled up. We may dream of revenge.

Of course, it’s reasonable to expect some kind of accountability, and even reparation, if we’ve been badly treated. This is justice, which upholds our society. But sometimes we don’t even get an apology. Offenders may get off scot-free, or even appear to thrive. When this happens, painful memories can loop endlessly in our minds, forcing us to relive them, and causing more anger and depression.

“Resentment,” St. Augustine observed, “is like drinking poison and hoping the other person dies.” He acknowledged that we can’t overcome such a toxic emotion on our own; we need God’s help. But it’s absolutely necessary to forgive others, if we hope to follow Christ.

Forgiveness is a process, in which we first relinquish our right to revenge. Instead, we hand our pain over to God, trusting that He sees all things and will be the final Judge. But our Work doesn’t stop there: we now purify our memories by turning them into compassion and intercession for the wrong-doer.

This is where many people balk, but it’s important to understand that compassion doesn’t mean forgetting or excusing hurts. It doesn’t mean that we’re obliged to continue a relationship, or even stage a reconciliation. An olive branch can be helpful, especially toward estranged family members, but our focus now looks beyond this world, and to the next.

We pray for all God’s children, especially the lost ones, that they may find their way to Him. Just as Christ forgave us, we need to forgive; just as His suffering redeemed us, we ask that He use our suffering to redeem. This is what St. Maria Goretti did on her deathbed, when she forgave the man who stabbed her. Her holiness was not about chastity, but divine charity – she turned a terrible wrong into love, and helped save his soul.

When we pray for those who persecute us, all things are made new, for us and for them. This is the real reason we forgive others, for such love can change the world.
