Dear Friends,


This last Friday I celebrated the school Mass in the parish. I mentioned at the beginning of my homily that my message was meant for everyone, not only the children. The gospel that day helped me to find the words to

speak. It was the passage where Jesus asked Peter if he loved him - three times!

Like us, Peter and the disciples were in a 'phase,' they didn't call it a 'red phase' of course, but after the crucifixion and death of Jesus they were confused and uncertain of the future - certainly a type of 'phase.' After his death and resurrection Jesus appeared to his disciples, like in Friday's gospel to Peter.

In this passage Jesus knows Peter's heart, he knows Peter loves him, but he knows Peter probably feels guilt and shame for denying him three times. Compassionately, Jesus gives Peter the opportunity to take back his betrayal by Peter telling him he loves him three times.

And as Paul Harvey used to say, "And now for the rest of story" - Christianity sprouted throughout the world and Peter was the rock upon which this new church was built - he became the first pope of the Catholic Church. **God had a plan.**

This coming week we will be meeting to plan dates for First Communions and Confirmations. We can only have small groups of people in the church at one time, so we will be in touch with families to schedule convenient dates when your children can receive the sacraments.

Same as above - we will be touch with the leaders of RCIA and the families of those who are making the RCIA journey.

We will schedule times and dates with them so they can receive all the necessary sacraments.

#### **OMPH 8th Grade Graduation**

I'm happy to say that the 8th grade graduates of the OMPH class of 2020 will receive a proper Graduation Ceremony. The location will be outdoors, the venue is still to be determined. We are all very proud of this class and we wish them God's speed.

#### **OMPH Catholic School Opening**

OMPH Catholic School is set to open in the Fall. There are many people working to ensure that your children come back to an environment that is safe and conducive to learning in a traditional Catholic setting. The challenges are great, but the rewards are even greater for your children.


As part of our preparations to move into the next phase we have formed a **Parish Strategy Leadership Group** to assist us in developing a policy and strategies for a safe environment as we open our church. We will have a Medical Doctor, a Registered Nurse and a half a dozen other parishioners who will assist us in assuring that the parish is safe as possible for the June 6-7 opening.

As we move from the red phase to the yellow phase some of you may feel apprehensive, or afraid to come to Mass - that's ok. Remember, the first disciples were also filled with fear, they were also human, they didn't know what to expect when Jesus left them and when he was crucified.

Perhaps as we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost this weekend, we can pray for ourselves and each other that we receive an 'extra' outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit guide us and strengthen us with all the gifts that we received at Baptism to help us as we move ahead, for us, and our children.


# NEW PARISH APP - myParish

The Angelus reminds us of the Annunciation when the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary with great, (if somewhat startling), news! As we read in Chapter One of Luke's Gospel, (Luke 1:26-38) God wished Mary, truly a model of humility, to be the mother of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ! We pray the Angelus to remember the wonderful gift of our salvation, and to give thanks to Mary our Mother for saying, "Yes"
