MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends.

Pope Benedict XVI spoke the following words in his homily when he was made Bishop of Rome April 24, 2005:

The pastor must be inspired by Christ's holy zeal: for him it is not a matter of indifference that so many people are living in the desert. And there are so many kinds of desert. There is the desert of poverty, the desert of hunger and thirst, the desert of abandonment, of loneliness, of destroyed love. There is the desert of God's darkness, the emptiness of souls no longer aware of their dignity or the goal of human life. The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast. Therefore, the earth's treasures no longer serve to build God's garden for all to live in, but they have been made to serve the powers of exploitation and destruction. . . . The Church as a whole and all her Pastors, like Christ, must set out to lead people out of the desert, towards the place of life, towards friendship with the Son of God, towards the One who gives us life, and life in abundance.

Pope Benedict's words give us a great place to start reflecting on the words from Scripture this Third Sunday of Advent, but especially the first reading from Isaiah. We all have deserts in our lives, the question is, what do we do when we encounter them? At times, many of us have found ourselves in the deserts of loneliness, desolation and emptiness, or perhaps even fear. We all desire that our deserts be turned into gardens that are flourishing like in today's first reading: "they will bloom with abundant flowers?"

Sometimes we get so caught up in our daily lives we simply find ourselves in the desert, or we simply love our way because of bad habits or we forget we are children of God created in His image, and then it's too late, we're in the desert!

When we find ourselves in the wilderness, we realize we are lost, and are all alone. No one is there to save us, nothing can take away our problems. But all is not lost, this is when we are ready to meet God, to reach out to Him, to open our hearts to Him, to put our total trust in Him. This is the opportune time to ask ourselves – *in what ways have we resisted transforming our own inner deserts into places of abundant life?*

This is what Advent is all about, opening our hearts to meet the Lord Jesus. As we reflect on the deserts in our life, the letter to James offers us some good advice – "to be patient" because the Lord's "coming is at hand." He is our Savior!

The first two weeks of Advent have reminded us that we have been in the desert preparing a way for Lord. This weekend we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. This weekend we rejoice as we look to Christ because He is the light that shines in the darkness of all those desert experiences, He is the only one who can bring forgiveness to those longing to be set free from sin, and He is the one who can bring lasting peace to those in sadness and pain.

Today we rejoice because by His birth, our Savior has conquered sin and death. We rejoice because our Savior will come again in Glory. We rejoice because our Savior comes again and again. Let us pray always that we be ready to greet Him when He comes!

ADVENT PREPARATION



St. Andrew's Novena

Prepare this Advent to welcome Christ by praying the St. Andrew's Novena. St. Andrew's Novena begins on the feast day of St. Andrew (November 30th) and ends on Christmas Day.

The St. Andrew's Novena isn't actually a prayer you say to St. Andrew; this prayer is focused on the birth of Christ, rather than on the saint whose feast day begins it.

Through this Novena, you can pray that Christ grants your deepest needs and desires at the moment that you enter into the celebration of His birth at Christmas.

NOVENA PRAYER:

"Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires...through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.

While most Novenas are recited once per day over nine days, the St. Andrew's Novena prayer is said **fifteen times** each day.

You can say the prayer fifteen times all at once, or throughout the day – that's up to you!

Remember, this is a very powerful prayer. Tradition holds that your requests will be answered if you pray this Novena with devotion.

Even if it seems like God has not heard your prayers in this Novena, have faith that He has heard you. Trust that He is lovingly preparing to give you all you need.

THE COOKIE SALE



Cart back this school year. Each month, two students take turns manning the cart, and this helps to enforce responsibility. So far this school year, the Seventh Graders have sat with Kindergarten and Preschool at Mass, helped Mrs. Hartman set up for events at the

school, stuffed bulletins, as well as run other MCA activities. "This group of students are always willing to lend a helping hand," Mrs. Pickett added.



Extraordinary Eighth Grade: The Eighth Grade has been working on their National History Day projects, focusing on this year's theme of "Frontiers in History," while diving into in-depth research skills in addition to analyzing types of resources. "This is a fun and exhilarating challenge for our students to not only expand and broaden their knowledge

of a particular topic of their choosing, but also an opportunity to experience various levels of competition," explained Eighth Grade homeroom

and Social Studies teacher Miss Caitlin Peters. The students have also been forming a deeper connection within their faith journeys to prepare for Confirmation.
