

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

An anonymous author once wrote;

"We the willing, led by the unknowing, are doing the impossible for the ungrateful. We have done so much, with so little, for so long, we are now qualified to do anything, with nothing."

What does this feast mean for us today?

We have a personal responsibility to share our faith. Faith in Christ is a grace, or rather it is the grace of graces. A gift given to us, but that we may not keep for ourselves. The first requisite for sharing the faith is personal witness. We are responsible for doing what we can in the sphere of our own lives so that the light of Christ really does shine from the city on the hilltop. Someone who is constantly bad-humored, or self-centered, or sad, is not a sign that God is in the city; or if He is, is not a sign that anyone would want to be with Him. Someone whose behavior and conversation is coarse and lewd and who profanes everything he sets his eyes on or turns his tongue to, is not a sign that the sacredness and the beauty of the good reigns there. Someone who destroys her neighbors' reputation on a daily basis will not inspire people to say, "look how they love one another." Someone who lives only to have more of the stuff of this world is not likely to make people catch a glimpse of the next.

What do I need to change, to be a more transparent window into the city of God? Most of us were born into a Christian family; it is difficult for us to appreciate how great a grace faith is, and easy to take it so much for granted that we fail to exercise it.

We can grow weak and be capable only of short journeys with few or no difficulties. Perhaps we can't even travel past the everyday obstacles to find Christ our Lord: this current health problem, that difficult sister-in-law, the way that priest celebrates the Mass, that particular habit my husband has, the constant nag of all-those-things-I-have-to-do when it's time for a few moments of prayer, what-my-friends-will-say (or think, or what I think they all think).

From the magi, who were making the journey for the first time, we can learn how faith perseveres, even when the star is hidden, until it appears again, and we come upon the Savior of the world.

As we continue through this New Year, let us never lose our childlike wonder seeking the Lord, and in all things let us never cease praising the God of our Salvation.

And may Mary the Mother of God watch over us and protect us always during this New Year.

RCIA is an adult faith formation process of conversion leading to reception into full communion with the Catholic Church. The RCIA may serve your needs if you:



- Were baptized in another Christian denomination and now wish to explore coming into full communion with the Catholic Church
- Are an adult wanting to be baptized into the Catholic faith
- Were baptized in the Catholic faith but are in need of receiving the Sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation

If you have ever reflected on making such a decision, be at peace! God, the Holy Spirit, is calling you and He will lead you. The RCIA process will help you to grow in faith and understanding of the teachings of Jesus and His Church. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Classes began in September, and continue until shortly after Easter. FATHER JOHN INVITES YOU TO EXPERIENCE THE CURSILLO MOVEMENT.

What is Cursillo?

The following is excerpted from *The Cursillo Movement: What Is It?* (2006, The National

Secretariat of the Cursillo Movement in the United States): To explain Cursillo to someone who has not experienced Cursillo is, at best, difficult. It's not because Cursillo is a secret, but because it is a living experience that one must experience firsthand. No one can fully explain how God touches a person. Christ, through the Cursillo and through His grace, touches the person who is open to a personal relationship with Him in a special way. The Cursillo can help the person in developing a deeper understanding of what it means to be fully Catholic by being fully Christian in order to exercise their mission as baptized individuals. The world [in the mid-20th Century] was in chaos because baptized men were not aware of the potential that the Grace of God gives them to be and live as Christians. Cursillo puts its emphasis on being Christian, not on doing Christian things; it opted for an apostolic movement based on the associated strength of friendship.

The men's Cursillo will take place January 12-January 15 at the Christian Retreat Center, East Waterford, PA.

The women's Cursillo will take place March 2-March 5 at the Mariawald Renewal Center, Reading, PA. (Fr. John will be spiritual director on this weekend.)




