

“Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them . . .” In a number of His post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus takes bread, blesses it, and gives it to His apostles. That language should sound familiar to us; it’s the language of the Eucharistic prayers of the Holy Mass. Beginning at the Last Supper and continuing until His Ascension into glory, Jesus offered the graces of the Holy Eucharist to the first bishops of the Church, the apostles. For one, it was necessary as a source of grace, for they had many doubts and fears until the Pentecost alleviated them. But more importantly, Jesus was preparing them for their most essential ministry: keeping His presence alive in the Church for succeeding generations, with the sacred gifts of His Body and Blood. The Good News of the Easter season is that Jesus is alive and in our midst. He still wants to work miracles in our world, the greatest being His Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist at every Holy Mass.

I thought the Church abandoned that? “Why do some priests wear Roman (i.e., fiddleback) chasubles?”

Lastly, the fiddleback chasubles are normally more ornate and thus add to the beauty and solemnity of the Holy Mass. As they are taut, or “stiff” you might say, they allow for more ornamentation, with beautiful Catholic imagery and symbolism. The usual draping chasuble has too much flowing movement and imagery is lost in the folds of the chasuble. In contrast, the fiddleback vestment has a certain rigidity which allows it to act like a painting canvas of sorts, thus conveying through sacred imagery some of the great spiritual lessons of the Holy Mass. Some fiddleback chasubles have images of the Blessed Trinity; Christ Crucified; the Blessed Virgin; the saints; et.al. Thus, even the celebrant’s chasuble becomes a catechetical tool to teach the profound truths of our Faith. Considering the great need for catechesis, especially in our secular culture, the fiddleback chasuble could be one more helpful catechetical tool. Their sacred imagery and sublime beauty could lead minds to contemplate the Divine and more importantly, to seek communion and life with Him.

So, the next time you see a priest in a fiddleback chasuble, remember that this is a time-honored tradition in the liturgical life of the Church. A fiddleback chasuble has its practical purposes, but more importantly, its aesthetical purpose. It adds glory and beauty to the Holy Mass, leading souls to praise the Father through Jesus Christ (the High Priest), by the power of the Holy Spirit. Saint Ignatius of Loyola wore them, as did Saint Philip Neri, Saint Pius V, and Saint Padre Pio. If they believed the fiddleback chasuble was one more spiritual-liturgical tool to lead souls to communion with the Blessed Trinity, then hopefully we will see them more often within the Holy Mass. The Holy Mass is heaven on earth, and the fiddleback chasuble reflects some of the glory of this divine liturgy.

May is Mary’s Month

In this month of May, the bleak North Dakota landscape comes back to life: flowers begin to bloom; the songbirds are heard once again; the grass becomes green and lush; the crops begin to grow; and the sun is warm on one’s face. After the death of winter, May announces the return of life!

How appropriate to honor our Blessed Mother in the month of May. Long ago, the world was also a bleak place, when man was held in bondage by original sin and eternal death. Then came the Blessed Virgin Mary with her *fiat*, her “Yes”, to be the mother of our Savior. With this, eternal life returned to our world, never again to leave. As Catholics, we thus honor Our Lady in the month of May, because without her obedience to the divine will, the world would be a sad and forlorn place. Mary gave the world eternal hope when she gave us Jesus Christ. Indeed, we are truly indebted to our Mother!

To show your gratitude, make time for Marian devotions in the month of May: pray the Holy Rosary as an individual or as a family; pray the Litany of Loretto; pray the Angelus three times each day; and prayerfully read the passages of the Gospels referring to our Blessed Mother. Even if it is a simple *Hail Mary* at the start or the close of the day, remind our Blessed Mother how much we love

her and how grateful we are for her obedience to God. As we enjoy the new life the month of May brings to our land, don't forget the new life which our Blessed Mother brought to fallen humanity.
