

“When the disciples James and John saw this, they asked, ‘Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?’” The heated response of James and John in today’s Gospel shows that they had not mastered the teachings of Jesus on love, gentleness, mercy, and forgiveness. Perhaps we are not good students of the Gospel as well. How often have we responded hatefully to hateful treatment by others? How do we deal with such treatment? But we should note that when we hate our enemies, we give them power over us---power over our sleep; power over our health; power over our peace of mind. Our enemies would dance for joy if they knew how our hatred was killing us, but not hurting them in the least.

Ecclesiology, the role of the Church in salvation, “Is the Pope really infallible and what does this mean for Catholics?” [Continued]

The teaching of papal infallibility was formally defined by the Church at the First Vatican Council in the conciliar document, *Pastor Aeternus*, which reads as follows:

Therefore, faithfully adhering to the Tradition received from the beginning of our Christian religion, for the glory of God our Savior, for the exaltation of the Catholic Faith and the salvation of the Christian people, with the approval of the sacred council, we teach and define that it is a divinely revealed dogma that the Roman Pontiff, when he speaks *ex cathedra*, i.e., when exercising his office as pastor and teacher of all Christians, he defines, by his apostolic authority, a doctrine of faith and morals which must be held by the universal Church, enjoys through the divine assistance, that infallibility promised to him in Blessed Peter and with which the Redeemer wanted His Church to be endowed in defining doctrine of faith and morals; and therefore that the definitions of the same Roman Pontiff are irreformable of themselves and not from the consent of the Church. If anyone should presume to contradict this definition of ours---may God prevent that happening . . . *anathema sit*.

In essence, the Church requires of her members *obsequium fidei* (submission of faith), meaning that

we are to give complete consent of the intellect and will to all of the Church’s infallible teachings on faith and morals. There is no picking or choosing which Catholic teachings we want to accept; to do so means we are not Catholic and cannot be saved (*anathema sit*). A true Catholic believes that the Magisterium (the bishops teaching in union with the Pope), guided by the Holy Spirit, guards, teaches, and explains the contents of the sacred deposit of the Faith which has been entrusted to the Church by Jesus Christ. Is this easy? Not always, because the teachings of the Church on faith and morals are countercultural in a society which is not only secular, but hostile to religious belief and practice. Many Catholics will indeed struggle with certain teachings, but there must be at least the desire, *obsequium religiosum* (a religious submission) to continue striving in faith for an acceptance of these teachings. They must seek out answers; seek to overcome personal opinions and prejudices that make them resist these teachings; and pray to the Holy Spirit for a spirit of openness and acceptance. Jesus expects no dissent from the teachings He has given to His Church for our salvation. As these teachings cannot and will not change (for Truth is timeless), then we must be the ones in need of change. *“Come Holy Spirit”*, must be the daily prayer of those who are grappling with a difficult Church teaching. With His divine assistance, assent will soon follow.

In regards to papal infallibility, we must remember that the Pope cannot err only in regards to teachings on faith and morals. So, don’t call upon Pope Francis to help you pick your next lotto numbers! But, do call upon his wisdom, and that of his predecessors and successors in the Petrine Office, as you seek to embrace and live a difficult Church teaching. Always remember that the Church is not placing burdens upon her children. No, she is lifting burdens, for when we live her teachings to the full, we find the joy that God envisioned for us from all eternity. So, stop being a pope or popessa for a day and heed the wisdom of the popes. Your soul will thank you!
