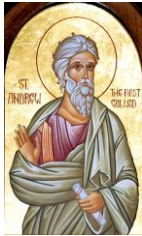

St. Andrew

Andrew the Apostle, also called Saint Andrew, was an apostle of Jesus. He is the brother of Simon Peter and is a son of Jonah. He is referred to in the Eastern Orthodox Church tradition as the First-Called. According to Eastern Orthodox tradition, the apostolic successor to Andrew is the Patriarch of Constantinople.

What were the miracles of St Andrew?

His Christian wife then had Andrew buried honorably. Saint Andrew is credited with numerous miracles. Among them, he freed the prisoner Matthias in Mirmidonia, healed a blind man, converted cannibals and the raised a dead child to life. The relics of the Apostle are known for the “manna” they secrete.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Many (some) of us watched the ceremony that in which Charles III was crowned King of Great Britain. The Ceremony was a mixture of old and new It was filled with pomp and circumstance, in which he pledged to serve the people as long as he is able.

This Sunday we honor a King as well, not however one born to wealth and crowned by a gold crown, but one born in a stable whose throne was the cross and was crowned by thorns.

Today we celebrate the Kingship of Jesus, the anointed one, our messiah. He is priest, prophet, and king. His kingship is characterized by service as well, but a service that is noted for its complete selflessness. A service that reaches to the ends of the earth and lasts for all eternity. His kingdom is of this world but beyond this world.

The preface of the day proclaims His Kingdom as an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace.

We were brought into this kingdom at our baptism when we rejected the devil and professed belief in the Lord as our savior. We were anointed with the Sacred Chrism, perfumed to let the sweet odor of Christs spirit fill the air. This anointing gave us a part in his kingdom but also a share in his very kingship. By that anointing we are called to follow our master, the Lord. As he served so we are to serve and in living in that manner we are more and more inserted into the kingdom and share in the joy and glory of the Lord.

Today we rejoice that we have been called into such a noble and important work: that of being. A disciple of Jesus and thus help extend his kingdom in the world though the work of the Church and the power of his love and grace. We have the mission to try to rid the world of evil sin. May we strive more and more to walk in the footsteps of the master and thus strengthen the presence of goodness, justice, love, and peace and thus become holy.

Advent

Next Sunday when you enter Church you will see an Advent Wreathe set up and the priest will wear purple vestments. This indicates we are in the season of Advent and are invited for the following weeks to prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus, our king.

The first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of a new Church year during which we celebrate the life of Jesus, His holy mother, and all the angels and saints. When we enter into these celebrations throughout the year, we are entering into those very same events that are made present for us in history sacramentally. This year is a gift to grow in holiness.
